Economic Situation

The financial year ending at the end of March grew by an impressive 6.9% of GDP - the economic slump caused by the pandemic was overcome and the Indian economy is back on a positive growth path. For the 1.4. GDP growth of 5.4% is forecast for the beginning of the financial year and between 6 - 7% per annum for the following years. This dynamic is supported by renewed private consumption and an enormous investment program by the government.

Special Developments

For 2023, India has taken over the G20 presidency with the theme "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" or "One Earth - One Family - One Future". G20 processes and meetings between ministers, senior officials and civil society take place across India

throughout the year. The highlight is the G20 summit (heads of state and government) on September 9th and 10th in New Delhi.

Economic relations with Austria

Domestic exports to India rose by 15.2% to 1.19 billion euros in 2022, after a new export record had already been set in the previous year and the 1 billion mark was exceeded for the first time. This very strong increase can be seen in all major export sectors.

Key sectors of the foreign trade center & business opportunities for Austrian companies

Healthcare System & Facilities

Investments in the Indian healthcare sector will almost quadruple over the next two years (from the current equivalent of USD 100 billion to USD 322 billion). This will make the country's healthcare system the third largest in the world (after the US and China).

Rising income levels, an aging population and growing health awareness will ensure high utilization of health care facilities in the future. A large part of the population in rural areas still has no access to adequate health care. On average, one doctor treats 1,700 people nationwide. These grievances create opportunities for new technologies.

Opportunities for Austrian companies

In view of the growing health needs of a population of 1.3 billion people, the successful use of new technologies such as artificial intelligence and big data as well as tele-health applications is of crucial importance.

Physicians are predominantly concentrated in metropolitan areas and residents of peripheral regions have to travel greater distances to receive medical care. In dealing with this problem, there is currently an increasing demand for telehealth applications. These enable patients to have digital contact with doctors who enable medical care and follow-up care after hospital stays. Large hospitals (Apollo, AIIMS, Narayana Hrudayalaya) have already adopted tele-health services and concluded a number of PPPs (Public Private Partnerships).

In addition, excellent business opportunities are opening up for providers of digital health platforms that collect and manage data from their patients on cloud-based services.

Automotive

The Indian auto industry, also known as the "sunrise industry", recorded an overall growth of 14.8% in 2018. A total of 29.08 million vehicles (cars, trucks, three-

wheelers, two-wheelers) were produced. In the next 10 years it is expected that 300 out of 1000 people will own a vehicle.

Upward trend in production

India is the fifth largest automaker in the world, seventh in the passenger car segment and number one in the two-wheeler segment. It is estimated that in 2020 India will be the third largest automaker in the world.

As an important international trading partner, 14% of the vehicles produced are exported every year. Here, the export figures recorded growth of 16% in 2018.

A total of around 4.01 million cars were produced in the 2018 fiscal year. This is a 13.79% share of the total vehicle production. Particularly noteworthy are the enormous increases in three-wheeler production of 30% and two-wheeler production of 16.12%.

The attractiveness of the production location and the significant growth figures have also led to an increase in FDI (foreign direct investments) in India.

Success factor location

The majority of Indian vehicle manufacturers can be divided into four different categories. The classification criterion is geographical location.

Delhi-Gurgaon-Faridabad-Ghaziabad-Gautama Buddha Nagar (North),

Mumbai-Pune-Nasik-Aurangabad-Thane (West)

Chennai-Bangalore-Dharampuri-Vellore-Kanchipuram-Thiruvallore (South)

Kolkata-Jamshedpur (East)

The southern group, including Chennai, is considered the largest, accounting for 35% of total sales. The western and northern groups both contribute approximately equal parts, with 33% and 32% respectively, to the total turnover.

With production facilities for many international vehicle manufacturers, Chennai alone represents 60% of the Indian automotive industry. Acted as an up-and-coming production location, many large companies are currently planning to relocate to the Gujarat region.

With these four production sites, India is poised to become the premier global manufacturer in the automotive sector. The Indian government wants to push these developments further and would like to use the full potential of the location.

Opportunities for Austrian companies

Many leading international car manufacturers are already active in the Indian market, creating low market entry barriers for Austrian companies. Combined with rapidly increasing growth figures, the attractiveness of the location is supported.

Companies can present their technologies in engine development and safety technology here. There are also opportunities to present these high-tech products to other producers from Korea, Japan and France.

In return, Indian manufacturers can benefit from Austria's technologies and successfully position their products on the world market. This in turn would also promise successful business for Austrian companies.

Ayurveda Symposiu m- India Day	14-16 November 2022	On 15 th November 2022, Ambassador H.E. Jaideep Mazumdar attended and delivered the inaugural address in the International Symposium on Yoga, Ayurveda and Meditation for Active and Healthy Aging' organized by Medical University of Graz from 14-16 November 2022.
		In his remarks, he highlighted the efforts by Ministry of AYUSH to promote research and awareness about India's traditional knowledge systems by way of establishment of AYUSH Information Cells, setting up AYUSH Academic Chairs with foreign institutes and deputation of experts etc. The International symposium saw participation of researchers, experts and students from Slovenia, Germany, UK, Czech Republic, Slovenia, Croatia, UAE, Austria and India.

Ambassador also informed the gathering about India's assumption of G-20 Presidency w.e.f. 01 December 2022 and the guiding principle of 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' with the motto - 'One World One Family One Future'. He emphasized that only with such a view of the world we can adopt a collaborative approach to face the common challenges, be it combating climate change or ensuring health, happiness, and wellbeing for all. He urged the scientific community to undertake collaborative research and bring out the benefits of adopting AYUSH practices for active and healthy aging. He also highlighted the opportunity offered by growing entrepreneurs and startup culture in India.

The Mission had also set up a stall and displayed a variety of India tourism catalogues promoting India as a destination for Yoga/ Ayurveda and health care.
