1. "You need perseverance to gain a foothold here"

It is these dimensions, which are difficult to imagine, that are putting India in the focus of the global economy. To reflect economic growth, India would have to create one million jobs per month. The share of medium-sized businesses has risen from 14 to 31 percent in recent years; by the end of the decade it will be 50 percent. With

a total population of over 1.4 billion people, these are crazy levers for establishing business models.

36 expressways are currently being built between the largest cities to speed up the movement of goods. By 2029, India wants to become the number one manufacturer of goods and parts of all kinds. Even though China is still referred to today as the world's workbench and India as the service center due to its IT and software skills, the world's largest democracy is consciously placing itself in this competitive position. A simple factory worker from India is now cheaper for companies than a Chinese worker. 200 euros in monthly earnings and ten percent of additional wage costs are on the bill of international companies. Nissan and Toyota have chosen India as the central production base for their small vehicles. Ford, Fiat, Suzuki and General Motors see India as a hub for their small engines.

Why India and Europe cooperate

The ideal time for India's new self-confidence lies in a difficult geopolitical environment. Europe appears unsettled by China's claims to power and politics. India, in turn, is involved in several skirmishes with China, along the shared border as well as in Indian areas of influence. India does not need Europe urgently, it grew too much on its own, at a time when Europe put everything on China because India, with its dozens of forms, appeared too fragmented. But the common mystery of China, the Indian economy's addiction to growth, and the highly specialized European companies are a denominator that could become increasingly important.

High-profile delegation

That's why a Styrian business delegation traveled to India, led by Chamber of Commerce Vice President Herbert Ritter. Among others: Markus Tomaschitz (AVL), Manfred Brandner (eee Group), Gernot Pagger (IV), Jost Bernasch (Virtual Vehicle Research), Bernhard Puttinger (Green Tech Valley Cluster), Michael Noest (Iesta), Christoph Ludwig (SFG), Helmut Wiedenhofer (Joanneum Research), Florian Kanzler (Process Engineering KVT), Oliver Werinos (Teubl), Arno Teuschler (Teuschler Holz), Bernd Meister (Uni Credit Bank Austria), Gerhard Elser (Transition IT), Martin Payer and Holger Friehmelt (FH Joanneum), Dominik Velikonja (Vegu), Günther Lackner (Terma Technologies), Udo Traussnigg (Campus 02), Michael Liebminger (AC Styria), Sonja Rauch-Hoephffner (FFG), Andreas Gaggl (WKO), Gerald Matzer (DAM). As well as the Styrian Internationalization Center with Karl Hartleb at the helm and Daniala Guss and program manager Christina Ulrich at the side.

The strategies

The core question that everyone is asking: How can you gain a foothold here in India? Florian Kanzler, Managing Partner at Kanzler Process Engineering, has already taken this path. "We started our work here in India in 2014," he says. But it was a tough road before doing business with Indian companies in 2020, in highly

specialized areas. Before that there were: reference visits, showing systems, building relationships.

Business in India is extremely diverse with its many regional differences. The personal relationship, the trust, almost a family bond, these are the triggers of a business relationship. It's not about being friends, but about a familial nature of the relationship - and trust. Today Kanzler works on highly specialized projects and processes.

The great opportunities

This also shows a direction where the Styrians could be successful, as Bernhard Puttinger (Green Tech Cluster) also knows. Important topics are recycling and how to produce in a climate-friendly way. Because India is also sliding inexorably deeper into an environmental problem. In cities like Delhi, life expectancy is even falling. The CO 2 balance is also becoming increasingly important for exports.

Even in difficult areas, the Styrians see opportunities, as a visit to the car supplier Sansera shows, which supplies BMW as well as KTM and operates internationally. Dominik Velikonja (Vegu) says: "It's impressive how far the technology has advanced here." Nevertheless, he sees points of connection. "For example, you need special small parts that we produce. This could be an opportunity."

You need a long breath

The full strength of India is also reflected in its giants, who sometimes waver. Like Tata, a company whose portfolio ranges from the car industry (Landrover, Jaguar, Magna also builds platforms) to software and telecommunications. IV managing director Gernot Pagger says: "You need perseverance to gain a foothold here. But the opportunities are simply huge." In-depth trips for Styrian delegations are already planned in some areas.

It is important to make contacts or to set accents through development aid projects. Or, as the AVL showed early on, to position itself in India. WKO Vice President Herbert Ritter concluded: "We can help shape the Indian transformation here, you can feel the spirit of optimism."

2. India as a beacon of hope: What the Styrians are planning here.

It is a 40-person delegation that set off for India at the weekend. With Chamber of Commerce deputy head Herbert Ritter at the helm (State Councilor Barbara

Eibinger-Miedl was ill), the top-class business delegation is supposed to explore opportunities and strategies for the Indian economic area.

For good reason: India is seen internationally as a beacon of hope. "Growth rates of over six percent are expected for the Indian subcontinent in the coming years, which stands out given the current economic situation," explains Karl Hartleb from ICS. He sees particular opportunities for increasing exports and also mentions India as an alternative to China. Areas? Mobility, plant engineering, automation as well as IT, digitalization and space travel. In this area, India is being developed as a leading global production location.

Even though Styrian companies are already active in India (such as Agrana, ams-Osram, Andritz/Hydro, Anton-Paar, AT&S, AVL, Efkon/Strabag, Magna Steyr, Münzer Bioindustrie, Voestalpine Railtechnology, XAL), there is still a lot of room for improvement above, due to the size of the market and growth rates. Infrastructure, environmental technology, energy, medical technology/pharmaceuticals and digitalization are other keywords. Styrian companies have a lot of know-how and technology, particularly when it comes to shaping the green transformation, which is of interest to Indian customers and partners.

Although there has been considerable growth in Austria's exports to India (2021: +23 percent; 2022: +15 percent), the share of total trade remains low: just over 0.5 percent of Austrian exports (share of Styrian exports only 0.18 percent) are counted. So far, they are only in 27th place among Austrian exports. A total of 150 Austrian branches operates in India.

Green transformation

IV Managing Director Gernot Pagger describes his point of view as follows: "The European Union has been negotiating a free trade agreement with India since June 2022. We see this as a potential lever to intensify economic relations with India and to enable a win-win situation in areas such as decarbonization and digitalization. India offers the EU access to its large and growing market, the EU supports the growth of the Indian economy with investment, technology and market access. And can also accompany India in its green transformation."

AVL and hydrogen

Bernhard Puttinger from the Greentech Cluster sees Styrian opportunities in the environmental sector and in green transformation around new industrial production plants or renewable energies as well as circular economy and process engineering or water management. Over ten percent growth in the production of renewable energies is predicted in India, and Styria can also make its contribution in this area. The Indian hydrogen initiative is "exciting," as Puttinger puts it. AVL List, which has long been a major international player in this market, is in a good position here.

Manfred Brandner from the eee Group explains that it is primarily about future prospects. India is one of the digitalization world powers, companies like Daimler are relocating their IT to India, many Indian companies are on a shopping spree, including here in Austria. An asset: One would have more trust than in the implementation of Chinese projects.

More than 200 million euros a year

State Councilor Eibinger-Miedl concludes the topic as follows: "Export successes of our companies are crucial for the positive economic development of Styria, as every second domestic job depends on exports. In addition to our existing trading partners, we also have to develop new markets with corresponding potential. India is an interesting but challenging market. That's why it's important to build up an appropriate local network. I am therefore confident that we can also explore concrete business opportunities. Our overall goal is to significantly increase the Styrian export volume to India, which recently amounted to around 200 million euros per year.
