- 1. Pharmexcil has conveyed during the visit in February 2023 that their exports are increasing to New Zealand. In the last 6 months, exports have increased by 20%.
- 2. Strict Bio Security norms make export of food grains and other such items to New Zealand very difficult. The suggested measures after detection of pests in a consignment are not cost effective. There are three options given to the importers: (i) send back the consignment or (ii) go for complete fumigation or (iii) destroy the whole shipment.
