TRADE PROMOTION/ PUBLICITY ACTIVITIES INCLUDING PARTICIPATION IN TRADE FAIRS, EXHIBITIONS etc DURING APRIL 2022 - MARCH 2023 Old High Commissioner gave a keynote address at the ANZ India Business Chember Global

01	High Commissioner gave a keynote address at the ANZ India Business Chamber Global Meet and Business Introduction which was held virtually on 7 April 2022. In his address, he spoke about the development of the India – NZ trade relations in recent years and the new opportunities in the business sector. The conference was organized by the ANZ India Business Chamber.
02	Indian Council of World Affairs (ICWA) - Asia New Zealand Foundation (ANZF) and New Zealand India Research Institute (NZIRI) Track-II Dialogue was held virtually on 27 April 2022. Amb Vijay Thakur Singh, DG, ICWA led the Indian side while Prof. David Capie, Director, NZIRI led the NZ delegation. First Session on "Changing Global and Regional Geopolitical Scenarios" was chaired by Amb. Rajiv Bhatia and Dr. Manjeet Pardesi, Senior Lecturer, Victoria University, Wellington and Prof. Sanjay Chaturvedi, South Asia University, New Delhi participated as speakers. The second session on "India-New Zealand Bilateral Relations – Way Forward" was chaired by Prof. Sekhar Bandhopadhyay, Victoria University, Wellington and Dr. Pragya Pandey, Research Fellow, ICWA and Ms. Suzannah Jessep, Director (Research and Engagement), ANZF participated as speakers.
03	India-NZ Joint Trade Committee meeting was held on 24 June 2022 to review & take measures in furtherance of bilateral trade partnership and co-operation in areas such as Agri, Pharma, Textile, Renewable Energy and services. The Indian side was led by Ms. Rachna Shah, Additional Secretary, Department of Commerce and the NZ side was led by Mr. Mark Sinclair, Deputy Secretary, Americas and Asia Group, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

04	NZ Trade & Agriculture Minister Mr. Damien O'Connor visited India from 19-21 September 2022 and had a series of meetings with Hon'ble Commerce & Industry Minister Mr. Piyush Goyal, Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture & Farmer's Welfare Mr. Narendra Singh Tomar, and Minister of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry & Dairy Mr. Parshottam Rupala. Mr. O'Connor also met INZBC delegation and Niti Aayog CEO Mr. Amitabh Kant in an interaction hosted by NZ High Commission in New Delhi. As Agriculture Minister, O'Connor spoke at the 'Farm to Fork' panel, showcasing NZ's investments in agri-tech, on-farm training and skills development, and climate-responsive farming as part of the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) LEADS Conference.
05	India-New Zealand Business Council delegation (INZBC) visited India from 19th September 2022 and had various meetings to discuss improvement in bilateral trade between the two countries. The delegation attended the FICCI LEADS 2022, met Invest India and CII teams, attended industry interaction with Niti Aayog CEO Shri Amitabh Kant organised by NZ High Commission and the delegation also met Mr. Tapan Mazumder, Additional Director General of Foreign Trade, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, which was facilitated by the High Commission of India.
06	India-NZ Business Council, in association with the High Commission of India organised the 8th India-NZ Business Summit in Auckland on 11 November 2022. This year's theme was India-NZ Trade Relations: The Road Ahead. The flagship event brought together key stakeholders from political leadership, business and academia. FM Nanaia Mahuta was the keynote speaker at the event. High Commissioner also attended the Summit and participated in discussions on ways to enhance trade and investment.
07	On 25 November 2022, High Commission of India in partnership with INZBC organised a business event-India Unplugged: Export-Import Pathways. High Commissioner in her opening remarks touched upon the opportunities and benefits in trading with India. During her interactions in Q&A sessions with the guests she assured full support from Indian High Commission. Other speakers talked about various aspects of the international trade, viz: scope of IT sector, Finance, Banking, Patents, IPRs and Exports.
08	High Commissioner met Dr Elena Duter, Ph.D. in Plant Protection, International Engagement Manager & Mr. Terry Meikle, CEO of NZAPI, NZ Apples and Pears Inc in chancery on 23rd November 2022 & discussed various issues which can helpful for apple & pears growers in India.
9	High Commissioner met Mr. Rachael McGuckian, Market Manager, New Zealand Trade and Enterprise (NZTE), & New Zealand Consul General to Mumbai and Trade Commissioner, Mr Graham Rouse in Chancery on 28th November 2022 & discussed trade related issues between India & New Zealand.

12	The High Commissioner visited Hawks Bay (Napier) on 5 December 2022. She visited Onga Onga and witnessed various new and emerging techniques of apples growing. She also attended a business workshop "A Taste of India in the Bay" organized by NZ Apples and Pears Inc.
13	Food Safety Minister Meka Whaitiri visited India during 10-17 September 2022 where she addressed the World Dairy Summit in New Delhi, the flagship event of the International Dairy Federation. During the Summit, Minister Whaitiri met Ministers and senior officials and discussed various issues.
14	Shri Saurabh Bahuguna, Minister of Animal Husbandry, Dairy, Fisheries, Government of Uttarakhand visited NZ from 27 to 31 December 2022 to study best practices in value chain development of sheep goat and cattle husbandry, dairying and fisheries in New Zealand and to explore opportunities of joint ventures with cooperative organizations, farmers associations and business associates. He met the High Commissioner and discussed possible collaboration with NZ in skill development, animal husbandry and other areas. He visited farms in the periphery of Wellington and Christchurch and also met Mr. Earl Rattray, Director, Dairy Farms NZ Limited in Auckland and discussed above mentioned issues with him.

25	High Commissioner attended India News-link Lecture series at Auckland on 27 February 2023 and spoke about the economic growth of India. The event was attended by Mr. Michael Wood, Minister of Immigration and Ethnic Communities Minister Priyanca Radhakrishan was the Master of Ceremonies.
26	On 28th February 2023 in Auckland, High Commission of India in collaboration with Duco Consultancy hosted a round table discussion on bilateral trade and investment. Presentation on Make in India & a few case studies were discussed at the event. Officials/ Entrepreneurs from various sectors also attended the event.
27	High Commissioner met CEO of Auckland Business Chambers Mr. Simon Bridges in Auckland on 28th February 2023 and discussed exchanging of business delegation to India & NZ. Also planned to host a few collaborative events on India-NZ trade opportunities.
28	On 13 March 2023, the High Commissioner met Mr. Damien O Connor, Minister of Agriculture, Trade and Export Growth in Parliament to discuss how to increase trade between India & New Zealand and also various pending trade issues such as lifting of ban on import of Indian mangoes.
29	On 14 March 2023, High Commissioner met officials from Zespri, Mr. Bruce Cameron,

	Zespri Chair & Mr. Michael Fox, Head of Global Public Affairs and discussed Zespri's business in India.
30	On 15 March 2023, High Commissioner met Ms. Lianne Dalziel, former Minister and former Mayor of Christchurch. Both discussed ways to enhance cooperation between the two sides.
31	On 16 March 2023, High Commissioner visited JIX technology company established by an Indian entrepreneur, where she witnessed the kind of work they have been doing in the virtual world technology. She interacted with the young team and appreciated their efforts.
32	On 16 March 2023, High Commissioner participated in a business event "Opening the Trade Gateway to India" organized by the High Commission in association with India New Zealand Business Council (INZBC) in which she & other panelists discussed trade & investment opportunities between India and NZ followed by QnA.
33	On 17 March 2023, during her visit to Dunedin, High Commissioner met John Christie, Manager, Enterprise Dunedin and his team; discussed potential opportunities to collaborate in the areas of trade & commerce and education.
34	On 17 March 2023, the High Commissioner called on Jules Radich, Mayor of Dunedin. Both acknowledged the role of the Indian community & agreed to work towards strengthening partnerships across sectors such as Education, Business, IT & Innovation.
35	On 18 March 2023, Global Millets Conference was organized by the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare as part of International Year of Millets 2023 celebration. Approximately 50 Indian diaspora members attended the conference in the High Commission premises and witnessed it live online. Prime Minister Modi inaugurating the two-day conclave on millets in Delhi addressed the gathering all over the world. Millet based products were kept on display and millet-based food was also served to the participants. High Commissioner highlighted how India has, in recent years, led several initiatives on the global stage on issues such as climate change, the international solar alliance and the coalition for disaster resilience infrastructure and international year of Millets 2023.
36	On 28 March 2023, High Commissioner called on Chris Luxon, National MP and Leader of Opposition and discussed issues relating to India-New Zealand bilateral ties including ways to strengthen business, culture & people to people links. The issues relating to immigration and labour mobility were also discussed. Mr. Gerry Brownlee and Mr. Todd McClay, National Party's Foreign Affairs Spokesman and Trade and Export Growth; and Tourism Spokesman respectively also attended the meeting.

Trade Queries -A total of **1262** trade queries were received from India during the period of April 2022-March 2023 and were duly replied.
