1	Engineering Goods	In view of upcoming Infrastructure and energy projects including renewable Energy in Bahrain, there is a considerable scope to increase export of Engineering goods & project exports.
2	Pharmaceuticals (300220)	India's share in Bahrain's pharma market has remained less than 3% of its import. Patented medicines and foreign drug companies dominate the Bahraini pharmaceutical market. However, the generic drug sector is expected to grow as the government is looking to introduce mandatory health insurance scheme and control costs. This provides Indian pharma companies opportunity to make inroads in Bahraini market. Recognition of the Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP) has been taken up by the Mission and the proposed annex to the MoU in Healthcare Sector to promote trade of pharmaceutical products may help in boosting the pharma exports .
3.	Electronic Goods (including mobile phone)	Smartphones are the single largest export items from China to Bahrain which is the largest exporting country to Bahrain. Similarly, other electronic goods constitute important part of Chinese export basket to Bahrain. With India emerging as hub for Smartphones and other electronic goods , there is considerable scope to increase our export of these products to Bahrain.
4	Jewellery of gold (71131910)	Gold jewellery is among top ten import items of Bahrain of which our share in the last year (2025) was only 6%. However, considerable amount of Indian jewellery is coming through UAE which captures 54% of Bahraini market. There is scope to increase our direct export to

		Bahraini market given popularity of Indian designs and craftsmanship.
5	Organic and processed food products	There is considerable scope to increase export of organic food, processed cereals, protein bars, healthy beverages, dairy products etc.
6	Coffee Products	The Coffee market in Bahrain is well positioned for continued growth, driven by growing consumer interest in specialty coffee, sustainable sourcing and home brewing equipment. There is a scope for increased import from India, especially in specialty, single origin Arabica, and value added coffee products. Currently the Mission is conducting a market survey on Coffee products in Bahrain with an objective to increase export of coffee products from India to Bahrain. This survey will develop a better understanding for enhancing trade of coffee products from India to Bahrain.
7	Renewable energy products	Bahrain is actively working towards diversifying energy sources, with solar power especially expected to generate up to 1,300 MW by 2040. So there will be a considerable scope to increase the export of renewable energy products and related investments from India to Bahrain.

- i. **(The Daily Tribune 02.05.2026) India raises cooking gas, jet fuel prices:** India raised yesterday the prices of commercial liquified petroleum gas and jet fuel for international airlines, according to a staterun energy firm, as supply pressures from the Iran war mount. Prices of bulk and commercial LPG cylinders have been revised," the staterun Indian Oil Corporation Limited (IOCL), the country's leading energy marketing company, said.
- ii. **(The Daily Tribune 05.05.2026) India launches Earth observation satellite:** India's space agency, the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), on Sunday launched a privately-developed Earth observation satellite "Drishti," developed by the country's space-tech startup "Galax- Eye." The ISRO posted on X that it was a significant milestone in India's space journey. Congratulating the successful launch, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi described it as "a major achievement in our space journey."
- iii. **(The Daily Tribune 07.05.2026) India, Vietnam target \$25 bn in bilateral trade by 2030: Modi:** India and Vietnam are looking to ramp up bilateral trade to \$25 billion by 2030, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said yesterday, following talks with President To Lam in New Delhi. "Bilateral trade between India and Vietnam has doubled in the last decade and reached \$16 billion. Today, we have taken several important decisions to take it to \$25 billion by 2030," Modi said in a speech.
- iv. **(Gulf Daily News 11.05.2026) Indians urged to cut fuel use as global prices surge:** INDIAN Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday urged a spate of measures including fuel conservation, work-fromhome practices and limits on travel and imports, as a surge in global energy prices puts pressure on the country's foreign exchange reserves.
- v. **(Al Bilad 12.05.2026) Top five states drive India's economic future in 2026:** The Indian economy is rapidly expanding towards new global horizons, and at the heart of this movement stand five states as indispensable pillars of national development. The importance of these states lies not only in their massive GDP figures but also in their leadership of technological innovation,

strengthening of the industrial base, and opening new avenues for international trade and digital jobs.

- vi. **(The Daily Tribune 13.05.2026) Modi to visit Netherlands for Strategic Partnership signing:** King Willem-Alexander and Prime Minister Jetten will receive Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi for a two-day official visit to the Netherlands on Saturday, May 16, and Sunday, May 17. The visit will reportedly focus on strengthening bilateral ties and on formally signing a Strategic Partnership between the two countries, the government stated.
- vii. **(The Daily Tribune 13.05.2026) India launches \$1.5 billion maritime insurance pool:** India yesterday launched a \$1.5 billion guarantee for a maritime insurance pool to shield its shipping sector from disruptions linked to tensions in the Middle East. The 'Bharat Maritime Insurance Pool' will "facilitate continuous maritime insurance coverages", amid the risk of wars and sanctions, the finance ministry said in a statement. The pool will cover "war risk for Indian flagged or controlled vessels destined to or starting from India in the context of the current Middle East tensions," it said.
- viii. **(Gulf Daily News 13.05.2026) Indian banks resume bullion imports:** INDIAN banks have resumed gold and silver imports after a hiatus that stretched for more than a month by agreeing to pay a 3 per cent customs levy that earlier prompted lenders to halt shipments, trade and government sources told Reuters. The resumption is expected to boost the country's gold imports, widen the trade deficit and put more pressure on the rupee, which is among Asia's worst-performing currencies this year.
- ix. **(Gulf Daily News 14.05.2026) Gold discounts in India hit new record:** GOLD discounts in India widened to a record of more than \$200 an ounce yesterday, as a surge in prices after the import duty hike triggered investor selling in an already weak demand environment, bullion dealers told Reuters. India yesterday raised import tariffs on gold and silver to 15 per cent from 6pc as part of efforts to curb overseas purchases of the metals and ease pressure on the country's foreign exchange reserves.
- x. **(The Daily Tribune 14.05.2026) India approves coal gasification plan to weather Mideast war crunch:** India approved a nearly \$4 billion plan yesterday to expand coal gasification a cleaner process to burn coal aiming to ease energy supply pressures caused by the Middle East war. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's cabinet cleared the \$3.92 -billion plan to accelerate the conversion of coal and lignite into synthetic gas, the government said in a statement.
- xi. **(Al Bilad 14.05.2026) India considers reducing taxes on bond investments by foreigners:** India is considering a significant reduction in taxes paid by foreign investors on Indian bonds as authorities seek to align their policies with global standards and attract capital inflows, according to sources familiar with the matter. The sources, who requested anonymity due to the sensitivity of the details, added that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has recommended the move, which the finance ministry is seriously considering, Bloomberg News reported.
- xii. **(The Daily Tribune 15.05.2026) Modi's UAE Visit Signals Strategic Shift Beyond Trade:** Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi is expected to visit the United Arab Emirates this week, in a trip seen as carrying significance far beyond ceremonial diplomacy and bilateral trade discussions. The visit comes at a time of mounting geopolitical uncertainty, rising energy market volatility and shifting global alliances, positioning ties between India and the UAE as an increasingly influential partnership in an emerging multipolar world.
- xiii. **(Gulf Daily News 15.05.2026) India tightens gold import rules:** INDIA yesterday tightened rules for duty-free gold imports for jewellery exports by capping imports at 100 kilograms per licence, the government said in an order, as the world's second-largest consumer of the precious metal seeks to curb imports. The South Asian country earlier this week raised import tariffs on gold and silver to 15 per cent from 6pc as part of efforts to reduce overseas purchases of the metals and ease pressure on foreign exchange reserves from higher oil prices.
- xiv. **(Al Bilad 15.05.2026) India raises retail fuel prices for first time in four years:** India's state-owned fuel retailers have raised gasoline and diesel prices for the first time in four years by 3

rupees (\$0.03) per liter, or more than 3%, to offset some of the losses incurred due to rising global crude oil prices, traders said. India, the world's third-largest oil importer and consumer, is one of the last major economies to raise retail fuel prices after shipping in the Strait of Hormuz was disrupted by the US-Israeli war with Iran.

- xv. **(Gulf Daily News 16.05.2026) India-UAE deepen defence and energy ties:** INDIA and the UAE agreed the framework for a strategic defence partnership yesterday, the Indian foreign ministry said, as they seek to deepen ties amid the Iran war. The two countries also signed pacts on strategic petroleum reserves and supply of liquefied petroleum gas during a visit by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the UAE, it added.
- xvi. **(Akhbar Al Khaleej 16.05.2026) Modi urges 'open and safe' Hormuz during UAE visit:** Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi called for an "open and safe" Strait of Hormuz during a visit to the UAE on Friday, the start of a five-nation tour overshadowed by energy and supply-chain worries due to the Iran war.
- xvii. **(The Daily Tribune 16.05.2026) India hikes fuel prices:** India's state-run oil companies raised petrol and diesel prices by more than three percent yesterday as disruption to energy supplies due to the Iran war mounts pressure on the economy. The increase marks the first hike in automobile fuel prices in India since the war broke out in February, prompting Iran's near-total blockade of the Strait of Hormuz.
- xviii. **(The Daily Tribune 16.05.2026) Adani agrees multi-million-dollar penalty in US court case:** Indian billionaire industrialist Gautam Adani has agreed to pay a multi-million-dollar settlement in a US civil court case linked to corruption without admitting guilt, his company said yesterday. Adani was accused of having participated in an estimated \$250 million scheme to bribe Indian officials for lucrative solar energy supply contracts.
- xix. **(The Daily Tribune 17.05.2026) Modi oversees semiconductor deal on Dutch trip:** Dutch tech giant ASML signed a deal with Tata Electronics yesterday to help build and scale up a semiconductor plant in India, overseen by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on his tour of the Netherlands. ASML, which makes cutting-edge machines to manufacture semi-conductors, said it would "enable the establishment and ramp-up" of the Dholera plant in Modi's home state of Gujarat in western India.
- xx. **(The Daily Tribune 17.05.2026) India's \$30trn goal 'to attract global investors':** INDIAN economy that is aspired to exceed \$30 trillion by the country's independence centenary in 2047, provides a huge economic opportunity for investors worldwide, and with the growing strategic relationship, the UAE is well-positioned to benefit from it, experts said at a conference organised by the Dubai Chapter of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI), attended by more than 500 professionals.
- xxi. **(The Daily Tribune 18.05.2026) UAE-India Seal Strategic Deals:** Agreements span defence, energy, and advanced computing. The United Arab Emirates and India on Sunday reinforced their Comprehensive Strategic Partnership with a series of agreements spanning energy, defence, technology, maritime cooperation and investment, officials said.
- xxii. **(Al Bilad 18.05.2026) India and Sweden aim to double trade with the support of a pending EU agreement:** Sweden and India announced a strategic partnership agreement aimed at doubling their trade and investment over the next five years, during a meeting between Swedish Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson and his Indian counterpart, Narendra Modi.
- xxiii. **(The Daily Tribune 19.05.2026) India, Norway agree to 'green strategic partnership':** The new partnership is "beneficial for the entire world", Modi said. Signed partnership agreements in the fields of health and digital technology. Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Norwegian counterpart agreed yesterday to a "green strategic partnership" deal aimed at promoting a clean-energy transition and sustainable development.
- xxiv. **(Al Bilad 17.05.2026) India receives LNG tanker after it transits the Strait of Hormuz:** Indian officials said Sunday that a tanker carrying 20,000 metric tons of liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) arrived at the Dindayal Port Authority in Kandla, Gujarat, after transiting the Strait of Hormuz amid the ongoing crisis in West Asia.

- xxv. **(The Daily Tribune 19.05.2026) Gulf Air Restores 75% of its Global Network:** Gulf Air announced a near-full return to normal operations, with 75% of its global network and destinations reinstated. Over the past several weeks, the airline has gradually resumed services across the Middle East, Europe, Indian Subcontinent, and Africa, resuming services to more destinations and reconnecting an increasing number of passengers through the Kingdom of Bahrain.
- xxvi. **(Akhbar Al Khaleej 22.05.2026) Africa summit in India postponed over Ebola outbreak fears:** India and the African Union have postponed a summit scheduled for next week in New Delhi due to the Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo. The Indian Ministry of External Affairs said in a statement: "Considering the health situation on the continent, both sides agreed that it is preferable to hold the fourth India-Africa Forum Summit at a later date."
- xxvii. **(Al Bilad 23.05.2026) India and Canada to discuss free trade agreement:** Indian Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal announced on Saturday that India and Canada will hold talks on a proposed free trade agreement from May 25 to 27, according to Bloomberg. Bloomberg quoted Goyal as telling reporters that during his visit to Canada, he will meet with Prime Minister Mark Carney and his Canadian counterpart responsible for trade.
- xxviii. **(The Daily Tribune/Akhbar Al Khaleej/Al Watan/Al Ayam 24.05.2026) LuLu Hypermarket showcases Global Mango Harvest in Bahrain:** The irresistible aroma of ripe mangoes from around the world is taking over LuLu Hypermarket as the much-awaited LuLu Mango Mania Festival officially begins across Bahrain. Featuring over 60 varieties of mangoes sourced from 11 countries, the festival brings together one of the region's largest celebrations of the "King of Fruits."
- xxix. **(Al Bilad/The Daily Tribune 24.05.2026) India raises fuel prices for the third time in 8 days amid energy crisis:** India's state-owned oil refiners raised gasoline and diesel prices on Saturday for the third time in just over a week, in a move aimed at reducing losses from selling at discounted prices and curbing a surge in fuel demand. Data published on the website of Indian Oil Corp., the country's largest fuel distributor, showed that the price of gasoline in the capital, New Delhi, rose to 99.51 rupees (\$1.04) per liter, while diesel reached 92.49 rupees per liter, an increase of approximately 1%, or less than one rupee, for each.
- xxx. **(Al Bilad 26.05.2026) India's peak power demand reaches record high amidst heatwave:** Electricity demand in India has surged to a record high for the second consecutive day, as extreme heat has driven increased use of cooling devices such as air conditioners. Bloomberg News reported that consumption reached an all-time high of 260.45 gigawatts (GW) on Tuesday, according to the Indian Grid Authority.
- xxxi. **(The Daily Tribune 27.05.2026) Sastra Pratibha' winners inspired at Embassy interaction:** Students who earned the prestigious "Sastra Pratibha" title in the Science Talent Examination organised by Science International Forum Bahrain met Indian Ambassador Vinod K. Jacob during an interactive session held at the Embassy of India in Manama. The session focused on the growing importance of science education and encouraged students to aim for academic excellence and leadership roles in society. The Ambassador also shared guidance on preparing for Civil Services examinations and explained the functions of various departments at the Indian Embassy.
- xxxii. **(The Daily Tribune 27.05.2026) India, Saudi FM attend Cyprus talks on Middle East:** India's External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar and Saudi Arabia's Foreign Minister Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud participated in the Foreign Affairs Council held in its informal "Gymnich" format in Cyprus. The high-level discussions brought ministers together to examine the evolving geopolitical situation in the Middle East and explore ways to improve coordination in responding to regional crises.
- xxxiii. **(Al Bilad 27.05.2026) United States, Australia, India, and Japan condemn attacks on commercial vessels:** The United States, Australia, India, and Japan opposed the imposition of transit fees in international waters, according to a joint statement issued at the conclusion of a quadrilateral summit between the four countries' foreign ministers.
