1.	Trade In February 2026, the top exports of India to Equatorial Guinea were Cosmetics and Toiletries (\$346k), Drug Formulations, Biologicals (\$131k), and Misc Processed Items (\$131k). In February 2026, the main imports of India from Equatorial Guinea were Plywood And Allied Products (\$96.5k), Iron And Steel (\$0), and Zinc And Products Made Of Zinc (\$0).	In February 2026, the year-on-year decline in India's exports to Equatorial Guinea was driven mainly by exports of Rice (Other than Basmati) (\$-724k or -92.3%), Plastic Raw Materials (\$-122k or -100%), and Packaging Materials (\$-119k or -92.4%). Meanwhile, in the same month, the drop in India's imports from Equatorial Guinea was mainly attributed to imports of Products Of Iron And Steel (\$0 or 0%), Zinc And Products Made Of Zinc (\$-6.03k or -100%), and Aluminium, Products Of Aluminm (\$-41.2k or -100%).	OVERVIEW In February 2026, India exported \$1.39M and imported \$96.5k from Equatorial Guinea , resulting in a positive trade balance of \$1.29M. Between February 2025 and February 2026 the exports of India to Equatorial Guinea decreased by \$135k (8.85%) from \$1.52M to \$1.39M, while imports decreased by \$1.59M (94.3%) from \$1.68M to \$96.5k.

Economy news highlights of Equatorial Guinea :

(1) Equatorial Guinea to host the upcoming ICAN Summit:

Equatorial Guinea will host the next ICAN Summit of the International Civil Aviation Organization. This high-level event will bring together aviation authorities and international experts to strengthen bilateral agreements and global air connectivity. On Wednesday, February 25th, the Prime Minister, Manuel Osa Nsue, who is also in charge of Administrative Coordination, chaired a strategic meeting with key ministries, in order to finalize preparations for the signing of the memorandum of understanding that will officially mark the organization's launch.

The Government of Equatorial Guinea makes steady progress in preparations for the ICAN summit, one of the most important events on the international civil aviation calendar. Specifically, the Prime Minister held a high-level meeting with the heads of Civil Aviation, Tourism and Tourist Infrastructure, the National Event Organization Committee, as well as the heads of Information and Telecommunications Departments, with the aim of reviewing the technical, logistical and protocol aspects prior to the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding with the International Civil Aviation Organization, ICAO. The signing of the agreement will constitute the official starting point for the organization of the event, which will bring together 800 delegates from different delegations of more than 74 Member States, aeronautical authorities, as well as representatives of companies and international organizations.

During the meeting, key issues such as the suitability of airport and hotel infrastructure, official transport, and private security were addressed, thus guaranteeing the comfort of guests. Another point addressed was the strengthening of telecommunications and digital connectivity systems, the institutional communication strategy and international media coverage. Inter-ministerial coordination will also be vital to ensure organizational success, as ICAN must be preceded by a ministerial summit. The ICAN summit is a strategic platform that facilitates bilateral and multilateral negotiations on air services between States, boosting connectivity, trade and tourism.

(3) Government demands a plan to make Equatorial Guinea's presence at international tourism fairs profitable:

H.E. Nguema Obiang Mangué has taken a firm step to boost the tourism sector of Equatorial Guinea, demanding the Ministry of Tourism present a detailed plan to make the country's exposure at international fairs profitable.

This decision was adopted during the meeting held at the People's Palace in Malabo, with the purpose of generating revenue for the State and ending inefficiency in the management of public resources. The initiative has been put forward after it was observed that large sums of money have been spent in recent years promoting the country at international trade fairs without achieving significant results. For this reason, Nguema Obiang Mangué stated that it is time for the tourism sector to become a true economic engine for the country.

During the meeting, which was also attended by the Prime Minister, in charge of administrative coordination, and several members of the Government, the Vice President indicated that, from this moment on, no official trip will be approved without a detailed prior plan that includes specific objectives, a work agenda, confirmed meetings, expected results, and real benefits for the country. And to achieve those benefits, Nguema Obiang Mangué raised the need to structure clear and ambitious action plans to develop a larger-scale, organized tourism model capable of generating income and creating employment. At the end of the meeting, the Vice President of the Republic demanded stricter requirements for granting licenses to tour guides, who will be required to pass technical exams on the country's history, culture, heritage, flora, fauna, and customer service. He also requested that visitors have health insurance, ensuring greater safety for both tourists and the national healthcare system.
