## **Economy news highlights of Equatorial Guinea :**

### **(1) The President of the Republic proclaims the City of Peace as the capital of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea with the signing of a Decree Law:**

**The headquarters of the Presidency of the Government in Peace City, capital of Djibloho province, was the venue of the signing of a Decree Law and the institutional declaration by which the President of the Republic, Head of State and Government, Founding President of the PDGE, H.E. Obiang Nguema Mbasogo, proclaimed the City of Peace as the capital of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea.**

The ceremony was held in the presence of the Vice-President of the Republic in charge of Defense and State Security Forces, H.E. Teodoro Nguema Obiang Mangue, the First Lady of the Nation Doña Constanca Mangue de Obiang, the presidents of the Constitutional Bodies, some members of the government headed by the Prime Minister, the provincial governors, the presidents of the PDGE monitoring commissions and the Government delegates located in the Continental Region. In his presentation, the Head of State and Government referred to his policy of structuring the national territory since August 3, 1979, which distributed the nation into territorial jurisdictions divided into provinces, districts, municipalities, urban districts and village councils, in order to ensure adequate socio-economic and cultural development.

The relocation of the capital to Peace City, the capital of Djibloho province , serves to prevent further attempts against the government by placing it in an area suitable for establishing a resilient and secure defense; drawing on history, President Obiang Nguema Nbasogo took the example of some countries that did the same, such as Nigeria, which moved its capital to the city of Abuja to put an end to the recurring coups that the country suffered in Lagos; Brazil did the same by moving the capital from Sao Paulo to Brasilia. It also breaks with colonial structures after 57 years of independence, so that the administration can rid itself of obsolete colonial structures that no longer have anything to do with the modernization of our country. Obiang Nguema Mbasogo states that this decision will bring positive benefits by ensuring the nation's political stability and preventing migratory movements towards large cities like Malabo and Bata. The City of Peace constitutes a convergent center of the Continental Region; it is very easy to reach from any district of the region; it is estimated that there is no distance that lasts more than 3 hours.

### **(2) Equatorial Guinea to host the fourth edition of Africamed Forum 2027:**

**The Republic of Equatorial Guinea will host the fourth edition of Africamed Forum, which aims to connect the country's business sector, in order to exchange experiences and establish cooperation agreements. This information emerges from the participation of Claudio Vázquez Elo Nve, Director General of the National Development Agency of Equatorial Guinea, at the third edition of the Africamed Business Forum, held from January 16th to 17th, in Casablanca, Kingdom of Morocco.**

Equatorial Guinea has been chosen the epicenter for the upcoming Africamed Business forum, for two main factors. The forum identifies the sports ecosystem as a key economic driver that will encourage African states to recognize sports-related activities as an economic engine impacting their GDP. This new approach, conceived by the forum, aims to position sport as a genuine industrial sector, capable of becoming a structuring force for economic growth, job creation, innovation, and continental integration. The epicenter of this third business meeting, which has categorized sports industry as the new frontier of African economic transformation, has sought to articulate strategies through three key panels: how football can move from entertainment to industrialization to increase the GDP of African countries from 0.5 to 5%, how sport can become a multi-sectoral catalyst and, finally, they analyzed the decisive role of sport in the private sector.

Holding this business meeting in Equatorial Guinea will open a key scenario for the country's businesspeople to learn about new investment formulas and establish cooperation with other prominent businesspeople in order to strengthen the national private sector ecosystem. "There will be a presence of businesspeople in the sports sector who will travel to Equatorial Guinea and to have exchanges with local entrepreneurs, given that sport no longer only arouses passion, but is also an economic actor for the development of African countries," said the Director General of the National Development Agency of Equatorial Guinea. Africamed 2026 Business Forum, held independently from CAN, has not offered immediate solutions. However, it has laid the groundwork for an alternative economic narrative, where sport ceases to be mere entertainment and becomes a driver of production, employment, and continental integration.

### **(3) Equatorial Guinea secures a place for the first time at the World Economic Forum in Davos 2026 :**

**The Republic of Equatorial Guinea begins to materialize the results of more than six years of constant, discreet and sustained work, within the framework of establishing and strengthening its relations with the World Economic Forum (WEF), one of the most influential spaces for economic and financial dialogue globally.**

This important progress has been made possible thanks to the technical leadership of the Directorate General of International Economic and Financial Organizations of the Ministry of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, and the support of the firm and decisive political will of H.E. Obiang Nguema Mbasogo, President of the Republic and Honorary Father of the Nation. The World Economic Forum is a strategic platform where forward-thinking countries with a commitment to investment and growth ambitions, engage with the world's leading economic, financial, and political figures. In this context, Equatorial Guinea has secured a place, for the first time, at the World Economic Forum's Annual Meeting in Davos 2026, becoming the first country in the CEMAC region to achieve this level of international presence and visibility.

During the Davos Annual Meeting 2026, H.E. Teodoro Nguema Obiang Mangue, Vice President of the Republic, delivered a solid and convincing speech, which projected Equatorial Guinea as a credible, reliable and strategic partner, as well as consolidating the country as the main option and gateway to the World Economic Forum in the CEMAC region. This achievement represents a turning point in Equatorial Guinea's international standing, ushering in a new era in the positioning of the country and Central Africa in key global forums. In this regard, it underscores the importance of developing a distinct, clear, and strategic narrative, supported by a robust policy of communication, positioning, and international engagement. After almost a year at the head of the General Directorate of International Economic and Financial Organizations, this milestone stands as one of the most relevant achievements of the first year of management, reaffirming the commitment of the Government of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea to strengthening its presence and credibility in the main international economic and financial spaces.
