In March 2026, the main imports of India from Equatorial Guinea were Plywood And Allied Products (\$614k), Other Wood And Wood Products (\$17.1k), and Aluminium, Products Of Aluminm (\$0).	In March 2026, the year-on-year growth in India's exports to Equatorial Guinea was driven mainly by exports of Coffee (\$176k or 5.12k%), Plastic Raw Materials (\$154k or 0%), and Iron And Steel (\$146k or 0%). Meanwhile, in the same month, the drop in India's imports from Equatorial Guinea was mainly attributed to imports of Other Wood And Wood Products (\$17.1k or 0%), Petroleum Products (\$0 or 0%), and Zinc And Products Made Of Zinc (\$0 or 0%).	Overview In March 2026, India exported \$2.25M and imported \$631k from Equatorial Guinea, resulting in a positive trade balance of \$1.61M. Between March 2025 and March 2026 the exports of India to Equatorial Guinea increased by \$1.17M (108%) from \$1.08M to \$2.25M, while imports decreased by \$1.14M (64.3%) from \$1.77M to \$631k.

Economy news highlights of Equatorial Guinea :

(1) Restoration work on educational centers to begin soon :

The restoration work on several schools in Malabo and Bata will begin soon. It was announced during a working meeting held on Thursday, March 5th 2026. The meeting was attended by the Vice President of the Republic, the Prime Minister, and other members of the Government.

To start the works, the Government established as a prerequisite the presentation of bank guarantees by the winning companies, in order to ensure that they have the necessary financial capacity to correctly execute the works. During the meeting held at the People's Palace in Malabo, GE-Proyectos reported that six out of the fifteen selected companies have already submitted the required bank guarantees. After verifying the submitted documentation, H.E. Nguema Obiang Mangué ordered GE-Proyectos to immediately issue the start orders so the companies can begin the restoration work as soon as possible. The Vice-President of the Republic reiterated that any company seeking to carry out state-funded projects must present valid bank guarantees as assurance of contract fulfillment, the quality of the work, and adherence to deadlines. With this measure, the Government aims to prevent situations that occurred in the past, when some companies obtained contracts without having the necessary resources or abandoned projects after receiving payment.

Likewise, in his interest in ensuring not only the completion of the works, but also their quality, the country's second political figure expressed his concern about the lack of technical tools that allow for adequate verification of construction standards during the execution of the projects. Given this situation, Mr. Nguema Obiang Mangué urgently instructed GE-Proyectos and the Ministry of Public Works to submit a detailed plan of materials control and construction standards to serve as a technical oversight tool. He stated that many of the deficiencies that appear over time in public infrastructure are related to the use of unsuitable materials or insufficient supervision during construction.

(2) Government considers transferring INSESO hospitals to the Ministry of Health :

Government grants 30 days for the completion of an inventory of medical supplies of the National Social Security Institute as a preliminary step to its transfer to the Ministry of Health.

The measure aims to reorganize the national healthcare system and strengthen medical coverage in the country. This decision was made at a working meeting led by the Vice President of the Republic, H.E. Nguema Obiang Mangué, on Wednesday, March 4th 2026, at the People's Palace in Malabo with the commission in charge. During the meeting, it was agreed that by the end of September of this year, the Ministry of Health will have absolute ownership of INSESO's assets, so that it can dedicate itself to its work of guaranteeing the well-being and social protection of citizens and their families at all stages of life. H.E. Nguema Obiang Mangué expressed concern about the double expense involved for the government in investing in CENTRAMED, a public entity responsible for the acquisition, management, and distribution of medicines and health supplies for the national system, while simultaneously authorizing INSESO to perform the same management in a private capacity. For that reason, he instructed the commission to find a company specializing in inventory management to account all the assets held by INSESO hospitals and report back to the Government. According to the Government official, this will aid in the decision-making process for restructuring these healthcare centers, with the aim of revitalizing their operational management.

At the same meeting, progress on the national malaria eradication program was also discussed. On this topic, the Minister of Health, Mitoha Ondo Ayecaba presented the steps of the malaria control

program, which began in 2004 and has reduced the incidence of the disease by 82%. Currently, the country is moving toward the final elimination phase. But the country has the ambition to go further with this plan through more modern and forceful tactics. For Annobón, H.E. Nguema Obiang Mangué approved the arrival of experts to conduct a study on the island and determine the level of malaria incidence in the population of San Antonio de Palé. Furthermore, he also authorized a study of the effectiveness and reliability of the R21 vaccine, which is known for its high efficacy against malaria in children, and also expressed interest in drone spraying and the sterilization of malaria-carrying mosquitoes. Finally, Nguema Obiang Mangué praised the professionalism and efforts of the Ministry of Health in making a significant social program a reality, in which the Government has invested a great deal of money.
