1.	870410 – Dumpers for off-highway use	Kazakhstan's massive mining sector (coal, copper, iron ore) and ongoing infrastructure initiatives drive consistent demand for heavy-duty earthmoving and transport vehicles. Domestic production of off-highway dumpers is virtually non-existent, leaving the country heavily reliant on foreign imports. India's heavy engineering sector has evolved significantly, producing rugged, cost-effective mining vehicles that meet international safety and performance standards. Capturing a substantial 24.4% market share in March 2026 highlights the strong and growing acceptability of Indian heavy machinery in the region. To expand this presence further, Indian manufacturers should forge long-term leasing, servicing, and maintenance agreements with major Kazakh mining conglomerates (such as Kazakhmys and ERG) and participate directly in their corporate procurement rounds.
2.	842959 – Self-propelled mechanical shovels, excavators and shovel loaders	Driven by extensive civil construction, transport corridor development, and open-cast mining operations, Kazakhstan maintains a high baseline demand for heavy excavation equipment. Lacking deep domestic manufacturing for complex self-propelled machinery, the market leans entirely on external suppliers. India's construction equipment industry has scaled up dramatically, offering highly competitive, fuel-efficient, and

		<p>durable excavators. Securing a 23.2% import share in March indicates strong market penetration and trust. Indian original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) can further consolidate this position by establishing localized service centers, ensuring ready availability of spare parts, and partnering with regional distributors to tap directly into state-backed infrastructure projects and public tenders.</p>
3.	732591 – Grinding balls and similar articles for mills, cast	<p>Grinding balls are essential consumables in mineral processing and milling industries, heavily utilized in Kazakhstan's metallurgy and ore-dressing plants. Given the continuous wear and tear in milling operations, the replacement demand is permanent and highly predictable. India boasts a cost-competitive steel casting sector capable of manufacturing high-chromium grinding balls that offer optimal wear resistance. India's dominant 87.5% market share in this category for March 2026 proves an overwhelming quality and price advantage over regional competitors. Indian exporters can secure this near-monopoly and expand export volumes by locking in multi-year supply contracts directly with Kazakh ore-processing mills while expanding into specialized alloy variants.</p>
4.	902190 – Articles and appliances worn, carried, or implanted in the body	<p>Kazakhstan is experiencing an expanding healthcare sector with growing public and private investments aimed at modernizing medical treatments, orthopedic care, and disability support. The country relies heavily on imports for sophisticated medical appliances, prosthetics, and implants. India's medical devices sector is growing rapidly, backed by advanced manufacturing and globally recognized quality certifications at highly accessible price points. Holding a 10.6% share in March 2026 demonstrates a solid entry point, but significant upside remains to challenge dominant Western and Russian suppliers. Growth can be accelerated through targeted B2B matchmaking with Kazakh medical distributors, compliance registration with the Ministry of Healthcare, and active participation in public tenders handled by the single state distributor.</p>
5.	851713 – Smartphones for wireless networks	<p>Kazakhstan features a highly digitally literate population with a competitive mobile telecommunications market and high smartphone penetration. The country imports almost all consumer electronics. Facilitated by the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, India has emerged as a global hub for smartphone manufacturing and assembly, exporting billions of dollars of devices worldwide. While India's current import share in Kazakhstan stands at a modest 1.0%, the market potential is immense given the sheer volume of Kazakh electronics retail. Indian manufacturers and global brands exporting from Indian facilities can capture market share by engaging directly with major Kazakh retail chains (such as Technodom, Sulpak, and Mechta) and deploying localized marketing strategies to offer premium features at competitive mid-tier prices.</p>

1.	Trade in Goods	In March 2026, Kazakhstan's imports from India were led by pharmaceuticals, heavy machinery, black tea, and steel products. The top import was 300490 – Medicaments in measured doses, valued at USD 8.9 million (109.9 tons, 7.8% market share). This was followed by a notable surge in industrial and transport equipment, specifically 870410 – Off-highway dumpers at USD 4.2 million (24.4% share), and 090240 – Other black tea at USD 1.7 million (36.9% share). Other significant imports included 722020 – Flat-rolled stainless steel (USD 1.3 million, 92.8% share), 300420 – Medicaments containing antibiotics (USD 1.1 million, 24.4% share), and 842959 – Mechanical shovels/excavators (USD 1 million, 23.2%	March 2026 data emphasizes the structural continuity of bilateral trade alongside emerging trends. India maintains its stronghold in Kazakhstan's pharmaceutical market (HS 300490 & 300420 combined worth USD 10 million), reflecting long-term healthcare dependencies. Notably, Indian exporters command extraordinary market dominance in specific niches: flat-rolled stainless steel (92.8% share), grinding balls (87.5% share), and black tea (36.9% share), indicating strong supply-chain integration. The arrival of high-value capital goods, like off-highway dumpers (USD 4.2 million) and

		share). Kazakhstan's exports to India remained raw-material intensive, dominated by 280470 – Phosphorus at USD 4.8 million and 252490 – Asbestos at USD 1.9 million. Notably, engineering components emerged with 860719 – Railway axles and wheels at USD 0.8 million, followed by 811269 – Cadmium (USD 0.3 million) and 720241 – Ferro-chromium (USD 0.1 million).	mechanical excavators (USD 1 million), marks a strategic expansion from consumer items into Kazakhstan's mining and infrastructure sectors. Conversely, Kazakhstan's exports remain highly concentrated in commodities feeding India's industrial sector, like phosphorus and asbestos. However, the presence of railway axles and wheels (USD 0.8 million) points towards a promising, higher-value diversification into industrial engineering goods. To scale up and balance two-way trade, future bilateral efforts should leverage India's manufacturing capabilities in machinery and electronics (like smartphones) while diversifying Kazakhstan's export basket beyond basic minerals.

Sailas Thangal emphasized the importance of holding the business forum and the opportunities for developing long-term economic relations between the two countries. As part of the event, Kazakh Invest presented Kazakhstan’s investment and pharmaceutical potential, encouraging Indian entrepreneurs to take a more active role in localizing the production of medicines and medical equipment in the country.

Bilateral: KAZAKH INVEST NC JSC held a meeting with representatives of the international company Acharya Group – Jayaditt Basani, CEO of Psionics, and Vishesh Chandrashekar, Director of Acharya Institutes. The meeting was organized with the support of the Embassy of the Republic of Kazakhstan in India. Acharya Group’s activities cover education, healthcare, infrastructure, mining, and natural resources. Psionics specializes in creating infrastructure and data centers for artificial intelligence. Acharya Institutes encompasses initiatives focused on developing a network of educational institutions. The Indian side shared its successful cooperation experience in CA, specifically its partnership with Uzbekistan, where Acharya University has established a campus in Bukhara. The Indian delegation expressed interest in investing in the construction of data centers and implementing educational projects. During the talks, the parties discussed the prospects for launching similar initiatives in Kazakhstan. Following the meeting, Asel Suankulova, Managing Director of Investment Promotion and Marketing Department, emphasized KAZAKH INVEST’s readiness to provide the necessary support for the company’s initiatives.
