# 4. Important India related statements of commercial significance by political leaders, think tanks, chambers, associations etc. / Significant stories/features on India related trade, investment, services and logistic sector, published in foreign journals/dailies, etc.:

• President Yoon will visit Indonesia and India next week...Participation in ASEAN and G20

President Yoon Suk Yeol will visit Indonesia and India in succession to attend the ASEAN-related summit and the G20 summit of 20 major countries for a seven-day schedule from the 5th of next month. Kim Tae-hyo, the first deputy director of the National Security Office, made the remarks today (31st) through a briefing at the Presidential Office in Yongsan. In New Delhi, India, the G20 summit will be scheduled and bilateral meetings with leaders of each country will be held. Mrs. Kim Gun-hee will also accompany her on the tour.

### • Hyundai Motor Co., Ltd. Produces 1 million units of its plant in India... GM Talegaon Acquires Plant

Hyundai Motor will expand its production capacity by acquiring General Motors (GM) plant in India, which has emerged as one of the world's top three automobile markets. It has made investments to preoccupy the Indian market at a time when factories in China and Russia have become difficult due to weakening competitiveness and the war in Ukraine. Hyundai Motor announced on the 16th that it has signed a main contract to acquire assets of GM India's Tallegaon plant at Hyundai Motor's India subsidiary in Gurugram, India. The Tallegaon plant in Puneh, Maharashtra, India, used to produce 130,000 cars a year, and GM stopped operating in October 2020. After acquiring the plant, Hyundai Motor plans to start production in 2025 and gradually increase production by improving its facilities. Through this acquisition, Hyundai Motor Group will secure an annual production capacity of more than 1.35 million units along with Chennai (820,000 Hyundai Motors) and Anantapur (350,000 Kia Motors).

### • India suspends import restrictions such as laptops for 3 months...What will happen to Samsung

A day after the Indian government imposed immediate import restrictions on vendors such as laptops such as Samsung, it reversed its decision and decided to implement a

transition period of about three months on the 11th. It also decided to impose antidumping duties on optical fibers in Korea and China for five years. The Indian government announced full import restrictions to protect its industry, but suspended them for now due to concerns over rising prices of related products. "Imported goods (currently under process) can be brought in without government permission by October 31, and government permission is required for import approval from November 1," the Indian government said in a notice. The government did not explain the background of the announcement. Earlier on the 3rd, the government immediately restricted the import of products from companies selling laptops, tablets, and personal computers in India. Companies or corporations that want to bring laptops to India to sell them are required to obtain government permission. In India, Samsung, Apple, Lenovo, and Hewlett-Packard import and sell the products.

### • Korea-India Security Office Strategic Dialogue..."Close High-Level Exchange in September G20"

South Korea and India will hold the 4th National Security Office Strategic Dialogue in Seoul on the 23rd and continue close high-level exchanges with the G20 summit in India next month. The strategic dialogue was held to mark the 50th anniversary of diplomatic relations between the two countries ahead of the G20 summit. Kim Tae-hyo, the first deputy chief of the security office, and Vikram Misri, India's deputy national security adviser, attended the meeting held at the presidential office in Yongsan earlier in the day. The two sides decided to expand supply chain cooperation around new industries, evaluating the continued expansion of investment by Korean companies in high-tech manufacturing industries such as defense and electric vehicles represented by K-9 self-propelled guns (India's "Bajira"). They also agreed to continue to expand joint research and cooperation in key technology fields such as IT, space, nuclear power, and bio. In particular, Deputy Director Kim asked for continued support from India, including simplifying customs procedures for Korean companies operating in India, according to the security office.

### • G&B S Eco Launches Solar Scrubber Shipment in India...'Cruise' to target 110GW market

While India, the world's fifth-largest economy, is rapidly reducing its dependence on China in the solar supply chain, G&B S Eco is speeding up its efforts to tap the 110GW Indian market. G&B S Eco announced on the 1st that it has started shipping solar ecofriendly scrubbers to India with a shipping ceremony. This is a 5.7 billion won scrubber equipment supply contract signed with Tata Power Solar, a solar panel manufacturer under Tata Group in India, in March, and will be exported to India. Starting with the shipment ceremony to India, the company also plans to speed up the shipment of 20 billion won worth of solar scrubber supply contracts signed a supply contract worth 20 billion won with leading Indian solar power companies such as ADANI, TATA, and Waaree, India's largest energy companies.

#### • Krafton to invest 200 bln won in 'big' for Indian gaming market

Krafton will invest \$150 million (about 200 billion won) in the Indian market over the next three years. Krafton India Corporation said in a local press release on the 10th (local

time) that it will contribute to the growth of the Indian startup ecosystem. Meanwhile, Krafton Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Bae Dong-geun said in a conference call to announce its second-quarter earnings on the 9th, "We will add Indian localization content in the second half of this year and focus more on the Indian market through large-scale esports events."

### • China's alternative market: India "Will provide a 75% investment support if Samsung Electronics and SK Hynix decide to invest in the state of Maharashtra"

Mr. Uday Samant, Honourable Industries Minister of the state of Maharashtra, who recently visited ROK to discuss investment cooperation with domestic companies. The Minister stated, "We can provide the highest level of incentives to semiconductor companies," adding, "We hope Samsung Electronics and SK Hynix will invest in the state of Maharashtra." If a Korean semiconductor company invest in Maharashtra state, the state will provide 75% of its investment from the following year. The combined support for these financial support is expected to be split between the Indian Central Government, contributing 50%, and the Maharashtra State Government, providing an additional 25%. The minister also emphasized the state's efforts to attract Korean textile and food companies. "We also hope to attract Korean textile companies as well," the Minister stated.

#### • Hana Financial Group MOUs with India's Largest Bank...Global Business 'Drive'

Hana Financial Group announced on the 6th that it has signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with State Bank of India, India's largest state-run commercial bank, to expand its global business. The agreement was concluded in the wake of a business meeting held during the Asian Development Bank's annual general meeting in May.
