





• NVIDIA COOPERATES WIDE AI IN INDIA..Partnership with Reliance and Tartier Infosys | CEO Meeting with PM Modi

NVIDIA is continuing its wide-ranging steps in India to expand its created AI platform and foster talent. It is going to collaborate with Reliance and Tartier Infosys in AI Solution and will support AI training for 50,000 Infosys employees.

NVIDIA CEO Jensen Huang and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi met at the prime minister's home. Prime Minister Modi said on his Twitter account on Sept. 4th, "I had a long conversation with CEO Jensen Hwang about the rich potential India offers in the AI world," adding, "CEO Hwang expressed his gratitude for the progress India has made in the technology sector and expressed positive thoughts on young Indian talents." In addition, according to Indian Express, a local media outlet in India, on the 27th of last month (local time), India is considering lowering tariffs on finished electric vehicles to up to 15% only for companies setting up electric vehicle factories in India at Tesla's proposal.

• Samsung Electronics Expected to Win '80 Billion' Incentives in India

It is predicted that Samsung Electronics could receive incentives worth 5 billion rupees (about 80 billion won) for mobile phone production in India. It is expected to conclude production-linked incentive (PLI) negotiations with India soon.

Mirae Asset Management Invests In Indian Clothing Fashion Company 'Sai Silk Kalamandir'

Mirae Asset Asset Management has invested in Sai Silks Kalamandir, an Indian clothing fashion company. Sai Silk Kalamandir plans to raise additional funds through an initial public offering (IPO). Sai Silk Kalamandir said on the 19th (local time) that it has raised 363 million rupees (about 6 billion won) from a number of anchor investors, including Mirae Asset Management India.

• Mirae Asset Management Invests in 'Amazon Fulfillment Logistics Center' In India

Mirae Asset Asset Management was the first foreign asset manager to enter India in January to directly invest 1.3 billion rupees (about 21 billion won) in a distribution center in the Bewandi region. This investment is Mirae Asset Asset Management's second investment in a logistics center. The investment was made through the "Mirae Asset Credit Opportunities Fund," a Category II alternative investment fund.

• Hyundai Motor India Delhi Exhibition Hall massive fire...Conducting emergency inspections by base

On September 9, a massive fire broke out at the Hyundai Motor Showroom in Lewari, Haryana. Police and fire authorities, who were dispatched after receiving a report, put out the fire, but the accident caused some of the Hyundai Motor vehicles on display to burn. An investigation into the cause of the fire is currently underway. An official announcement is due later this month. No casualties have been reported yet.
