**Economy news highlights of Equatorial Guinea :**

**(1) Noble Group presents to the Malabo Executive its willingness to invest in Equatorial Guinea:** Following Equatorial Guinea's participation in the US-Africa Summit, held in the Angolan capital, in which the Head of Administrative Coordination participated on behalf of President of Equatorial Guinea, H.E. Obiang Nguema Mbasogo - a forum that was conducive for Mr. Manuel Osa Nsue, Prime Minister to hold several meetings with different international investors and visit the industrial zone in which several companies operate - almost a week later, Noble Group arrives in Malabo, the first company that has submitted its application to invest in Equatorial Guinea.

The Noble Group firm was received at a meeting led by the Prime Minister of the Government, Manuel Osa Nsue, in which he was assisted by the First Deputy Prime Minister, the Minister Secretary General, the Minister of Transport, Agriculture and Forestry, as well as members of the General Treasury, Chamber of Commerce, Finance and Holding. Mr. Manuel Osa Nsue has made clear the role that the Government plays with the different investors who want to invest in Equatorial Guinean soil, assuring that the Executive accepts the investments and Equatorial Guinea is ready to accompany and support the investors who want to work hand in hand with the country in the development plan of Equatorial Guinea, making clear the full willingness of the Malabo administration.

Noble Group is a company with 24 years of experience in the production of accessible and quality products, both for consumption and diverse uses, with more than 60 brands and more than 450 diverse items manufactured in Angola, a production that ranges from food products, cosmetics, hygiene products, packaging products such as cardboard or plastics to the manufacture of motorcycles, a whole range of experience that the firm wishes to implement from now on in Equatorial Guinea.

**(2) Vice President's meeting with the company GESUBA:** During the meeting held at the People's Palace, chaired by the Vice President of the Republic, H.E. Nguema Obiang Mangué, adjustments to the technical clauses of the contract were discussed. One of the points of debate was the distribution of the aboveground water tanks, especially in areas located at sea level.

In a bid to improve the country's water infrastructure, the Government consolidates a strategic agreement with the Chinese company GESUBA, which is in charge of executing the comprehensive project for the supply and conveyance of drinking water on Bioko Island. The proposed contract establishes a water supply system that includes the construction of elevated reservoirs. These components will ensure the stability of the service during emergencies, such as prolonged droughts or power outages. SE Nguema Obiang Mangué has instructed the Prime Minister, in charge of Administrative Coordination, to monitor the process, from the contractual review to the technical implementation.

The project marks a milestone in the modernization of basic services in Malabo, with a direct impact on the social well-being and water security of the population. It is expected that, once the technical reviews are completed, construction can begin in the near future.

**(3) Equatorial Guinea and Afreximbank sign key agreements for strategic energy and gas projects** : The Deputy Minister of the Treasury and State Assets, Milagrosa Obono Angüe, presided on Sunday, July 13, in one of the conference rooms of Sipopo, over the signing ceremony of two important agreements, which mark the beginning of a new stage of financial cooperation between both institutions.

The signed agreements include a memorandum on development cooperation planning between Equatorial Guinea and Afreximbank for the period 2025-2027, as well as an economic and technical cooperation agreement. These documents establish a framework for financing key projects in sectors such as hydrocarbons, agribusiness, small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), and trade.

The first signed document outlines the financial terms for financing the final phase of the Sendje Hydroelectric Power Plant. This infrastructure, with a capacity exceeding 200 megawatts, not only addresses internal electricity generation needs but is also a project of subregional interest within the CEMAC area, given its strategic location. The second document addresses the Technical Assistance Contract between SONAGAS SA and Afreximbank, which establishes the mandate to mobilize financing for the development of the EG-27 Gas Field, located in Equatorial Guinean jurisdictional waters.

This agreement will allow the immediate structuring of the financial plan for this project, thus reinforcing Equatorial Guinea's position as a key player in the Central African gas sector. The document relating to the Sendje Hydroelectric Power Plant has been signed by the Minister of Finance, Planning and Economic Development, Iván Ebé Molina, together with the representative of Afreximbank; and the signing of the Technical Assistance Contract for the EG-27 Gas Field by the General Director of SONAGAS, Segismundo Nguema Nsue, and the representative of Afreximbank.
