The Mission has taken up the matter with the National Office for Food Safety (ONSSA), requesting that authorisation be granted for a second test of the rejected consignment. ONSSA replied that that, under the procedures applied in Morocco for official controls on pesticide residues, a second analysis is not granted for non-compliance cases related to pesticide residues. The analytical results issued by the competent laboratory constitute the basis for the official control decision. For returning back the cargo, the letter of abandonment of shipment from the Moroccan consignee is mandatory. They have made several attempts to contact the Moroccan but they were not replying back. We subsequently requested the Moroccan company to submit the original hard copy of the NOC to the forwarding agent in Morocco to facilitate the return of the consignment. However, the company has since ceased responding to our emails and calls.
