However, they informed that they will study the case of Custom duties and penalty on old consignments.						
2		The Indian company requested Mission's Intervention for recovery of outstanding amount advanced for business collaboration. Mission contacted both companies over phone and through email requesting to resolve the issue amicably at the earliest.
