1.	Mining Sector	Sierra Leone's mining industry has performed strongly in the first seven months of 2024, significantly boosting export revenue, as reported by the National Minerals Agency. Iron ore dominated, accounting for 69.2% of total mineral exports, driven by global demand from steel-producing countries. Diamond exports contributed 10%, while heavy mineral concentrates made up 10.6%, showcasing the sector's diverse portfolio. Other minerals such as gold (1.2%), bauxite (1.6%), rutile (1.4%), zircon in concentrate (5.1%), ilmenite (0.6%), and coltan (0.2%) also play important roles. While iron ore remains crucial for foreign exchange earnings, diversifying the mining sector could help mitigate risks from global price fluctuations. Investments in value- added processing and infrastructure may further enhance the industry's long-term sustainability, solidifying mineral exports as a key driver of economic growth in Sierra Leone.	Sierra Leone's mining industry recorded strong performance in the first seven months of 2024, with significant growth in export revenues, according to the National Minerals Agency. Iron ore remained the dominant export, comprising 69.2% of total mineral exports, largely driven by strong global demand from steel-producing nations. While this underscores the country's comparative advantage in iron ore, it also highlights the sector's vulnerability to global price fluctuations. Diamond exports (10%) and heavy mineral concentrates (10.6%) contributed meaningfully, reflecting a gradually diversifying mineral base. Smaller but strategic contributions came from minerals such as gold, bauxite, rutile, zircon, ilmenite, and coltan. Although their individual shares are modest, these resources offer potential for expansion and can play a critical role in reducing overdependence on iron ore. The analysis points to the importance of diversifying not only the range of mined minerals but also their processing through value-added initiatives. Investments in local refining, infrastructure, and logistics could improve the sector's resilience and capture greater economic value domestically.
