Trade	The Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy (MOTIE) announced on June 1 that Korea's exports in May declined 15.2% year-on-year to USD 52.2 billion and imports fell 14.0% to \$54.3 billion, resulting in a trade balance of \$2.1 billion deficit, which has been continuously improving since January.	Imports for May dropped 14.0% as a consequence of the reduced import of crude oil (down 16.2%), gas (down 20.2%), coal (down 35.1%) and energy (down 20.6%). By item, automobile exports rose for the 11th consecutive month, and general machinery showed positive growth. Semiconductors, petrochemicals and petroleum products decreased in shipments, owing to diminishing global demand and drops in oil and unit price. Exports of finished vehicle exports expanded across the U.S. and EU, as demand for cars with high export unit prices, like eco-friendly vehicles and SUVs, continued to increase. Automobile exports in May hit historic highs, amounting to \$29.4 billion. Semiconductor exports fell (down 36.2%) in accordance with falling DRAM and product prices. The high base effect from last year's strong May exports (\$11.5 billion) also downplayed this month's chip exports. Display exports declined 7.4%, but OLED exports saw positive growth for the first time in seven months, thanks to demand (up 3.8%) spurred by the release of a new TV model. For secondary batteries, EV batteries increased in exports, but lower number of operating days and decline of ESS battery exports led to reduced overall exports year-on-year. Meanwhile, cathode materials soared 17.3% in exports to \$1.2 billion. Petroleum products (down 33.2%) dropped in exports as oil price falls

			lowered petroleum product prices. The high base effect from last year's May exports sharpened the decline.
			Steel exports (down 8.8%) fell as the unit price of iron ore dropped and shipments to China, ASEAN and the EU decreased.
			By region, exports to the U.S. (down 1.5%) dropped despite growing demand for automobiles and general machinery, as shipments of semiconductors, computers and IT devices dropped.
			Shipments to the EU (down 3.0%) shrank in spite of high demand for automobiles and car parts, as the slowdown of the manufacturing sector led to reduced demand for intermediate materials like steel and petrochemicals.
			Shipments to the ASEAN region (down 21.2%) decreased as a result of weak global demand and Vietnam's shrinking overall imports and exports.
			Shipments to China (down 20.8%) continued to fall as demand for semiconductors, petrochemicals and wireless communication devices dropped.

• EM&I completes establishment of Indian subsidiary in July

In May, EM&I signed a business agreement with Indian automaker Brisk EV (BriskEV) to enter the electric motorcycle market. As the first achievement of the agreement, it will develop and deliver a display instrument panel (cluster) to be mounted on Brisk EV electric motorcycles, and start supplying domestic batteries.

• Kia Motors Launches Vocational Training Development Program for Women

According to Kia India Sales Corporation (KMI) on the 26th, Kia launched a women-only vocational training program with the local non-profit organization Timbaktu Collective on the 23rd. Team Boxtu Collective is a non - profit organization related to renewable agriculture. It aims to protect, manage, and restore the degraded ecosystem of rural village communities. Representatively, there are restoration of wasteland through various types of tree planting, solving water supply problems, and restoring soil health. It is said to have been active in 172 villages in Anantapur and has helped about 21,000 underprivileged families.

• Competition Commission of India (CCI) Ends LG Electronics Lawsuit...Conclusion "No Cases of Violation of Competition Law"

According to CCI, an Indian anti-trust investigation agency, it cleared LG Electronics of violating Articles 3 and 4 of the Competition Act on the 20th (local time) by "Perfect Infra Engineers Limited (PIL)." CCI judged that there are various players in the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) solution market such as India's high-efficiency high-capacity system air conditioner (VRF), so LG Electronics cannot be considered to have a dominant position. In addition to LG Electronics, Daikin, Samsung Electronics, Panasonic, and Hire were cited as examples. In particular, Daikin, the No. 1 player in the country, accounted for an average of 44% of the market for three years from 2020, while LG Electronics' market share was only 16%. Regarding the claim that LG Electronics violated Article 3 of the Competition Act, he explained that the charges are not proven because PIL does not provide appropriate grounds. Even when looking at the market structure, it was concluded that no issue was found with LG Electronics.

• Youngone Trade's Expansion of Overseas Business

Chairman Sung Ki-hak attended the groundbreaking ceremony held at Kakatiya Mega Textile Park (hereinafter referred to as KMTP) in Warangal, Telangana, India on the 17th (local time). Chairman Sung Ki-hak, Minister of Industry and IT of Telangana State Kalvakuntla Taraka Rama Rao, and Ambassador to the Embassy of the Republic of Korea Jang Jae-bok also participated in the groundbreaking ceremony. Earlier in December 2019, it signed a memorandum of understanding with the Indian government of Telangana on investment worth 900 million rupees (about 14.2 billion won). The following year, the company established Evertop Textile & Apparel Complex Private Ltd, a local subsidiary in India, and completed preparations to secure local production capacity, and began its global business in earnest.

• India's lithium development '5.9 million tons' 'love call' to local government LX International

The Indian government will auction off lithium mining rights in the Leash region of Jammu and Kashmir at the end of the year, it reported. It is estimated that at least 12 companies, including LX International and Indian conglomerates Reliance Industries, Andani and Vedanta Group, will participate. The winning bid company has the authority to develop India's first large-scale lithium burial site. India's Geological Research Institute confirmed about 5.9 million tons of lithium reserves in the region in February. This accounts for about 5.7% of the world's lithium reserves. It is the seventh-largest lithium burial site in the world that has been discovered so far.

• CJ Logistics Certifies as a 'Good Company to Work in India'...two years in a row

CJ Darcl, an Indian affiliate of CJ Korea Express, was selected as a "good company to work for." It has been recognized for two consecutive years since last year. CJ Daseul, which was acquired by CJ Korea Express in 2017, is said to be leading win-win management by creating a corporate culture in which companies and employees can grow together.
