

The United States announced new additional tariffs on its trading partners on 31 July 2025. Since 7 August 2025, an additional tariff of 39% is imposed on Swiss exports to the US. Existing exemptions from the baseline additional tariff will remain in place. The sector-specific additional tariffs currently applied to steel and aluminium products (50%), cars and car parts (25%) and semi-finished copper products and copper-intensive derivative products (50%) will remain in place.

Indian competent authority has to communicate the compliance guarantee, failing which animal origin products intended for human consumption including aquaculture products will be denied access to the EU market w.e.f. 3.9.2026.

 - Federal Councillor Ignazio Cassis official visit to Nepal and Bhutan: On 09 July 2025, Swiss Federal Department of Foreign Affairs FDFA reported that Swiss Federal Councillor and head of FDFA, Federal Councillor Ignazio Cassis visited Nepal and Bhutan during his week-long official trip to Asia from 7 to 9 July. On 7 July, Mr Cassis met Nepalese Prime Minister Khadga Prasad Sharma Oli and Minister of Home Affairs Ramesh Lekhak for official talks in Kathmandu. The discussions centred on ways in which economic ties between the two countries can be strengthened. Mr Cassis highlighted the importance of deepening economic relations with Nepal as an emerging market with a population of over 31 million. On 8-9 July 2025, Mr Cassis visited the Kingdom of Bhutan to mark 40 years of diplomatic relations between Switzerland and Bhutan. During his stay, the head of the FDFA met Dasho Tshering Tobgay, Prime Minister of Bhutan, and Lyonpo D.N. Dhungyel, Minister for Foreign Affairs and External Trade. He also met with His Majesty Jigme Singye Wangchuck, the fourth king of Bhutan, in the capital Thimphu. The discussions focused on regional cooperation on sustainability and strengthening economic ties. - DTA between Switzerland-Serbia entered into force on 18 July 2025: On 28 July 2025, Swiss Bilateral Tax Issues and Double Taxation Treaties Section, State Secretariat for International Finance SIF reported that following the completion of the ratification procedures of the amending protocol to the Double Taxation Agreement (DTA) between Switzerland and Serbia entered into force on 18 July 2025. However, SIF also added that with a few exceptions, most of the changes will apply from 1 January 2026. The protocol implements the minimum standards for double taxation agreements. In particular, it contains an abuse clause which refers to the main purpose of an arrangement or transaction and thus ensures that the DTA is not abused. It contains also an administrative assistance clause in accordance with the international standard for the exchange of information upon request. - Additional agreement to the DTA between Switzerland-France came into force of 24 July 2025: On 29 July 2025, Swiss Bilateral Tax Issues and Double Taxation Treaties Section, State Secretariat for International Finance SIF reported that the additional agreement to the Double Taxation Agreement (DTA) between Switzerland and France entered into force on 24 July 2025. Its provisions, which permanently regulate the

taxation of income from home office work, will apply from 1 January 2026. The new solution also provides that the employer's country will transfer 40% of the taxes it has levied on home office compensation in the employee's country of residence to the latter. Automatic exchange of information on wage data will ensure that the new rules are applied. The additional agreement updates other provisions as, it brings the DTA into line with the results of the OECD's work on base erosion and profit shifting (BEPS). • **Swiss CPI increased by 0.2% in June 2025:** On 03 July 2025, Swiss Federal Statistical Office FSO reported an increase in Swiss Consumer Price Index (CPI) by 0.2% in June 2025 compared with the previous month, reaching 107.8 points. Inflation was +0.1% compared with the same month of the previous year. The 0.2% increase compared with the previous month is due to several factors including rising prices for international package holidays, hotels and supplementary accommodation. The hire of private means of transport and various vegetables also recorded a price increase. In contrast, prices for petrol, air transport and stone fruits decreased. • Switzerland EMPA developed scalable supercapacitor technology made from graphene: On 30 July 2025, Researchers at Laboratory for Functional Polymers, Swiss Federal Laboratory for Materials Testing and Research EMPA reported to have developed scalable supercapacitor technology made from graphene that aims at revolutionizing energy technology. Based on this a team of Empa researchers wants to develop better supercaps based on graphene and make them ready for large-scale commercial production. This graphene ink offers a decisive advantage in the production of supercapacitor electrodes. By cleverly mixing two different types of graphene, the researchers can selectively influence the size of the pores between the graphene layers. • **Switzerland to procure five IRIS-T SLM systems for ground-based air defence**: On 22 July 2025, Swiss Federal Office for Defence Procurement armasuisse reported that to protect its population from medium-range threats from the air, Switzerland is procuring five IRIS-T SLM systems for ground-based air defence. The procurement is part of the

European Sky Shield Initiative (ESSI) and the contract for Switzerland has now been signed between the Federal Office of Equipment, Information Technology and In-Service Support of the German Armed Forces and the manufacturer Diehl Defence GmbH & Co. KG, after the authorization from the Federal Office for Defence Procurement armasuisse. (www.news.admin.ch/en/newnsb/ZjsNYPpgoETj)

• US informed Switzerland on delayed delivery of Patriot GBAD systems: On 17 June 2025, General Secretariat DDPS reported that United States Department of Defense has informed to the Swiss Federal Department of Defence, Civil Protection and Sport DDPS that due to the Ukraine conflict, it has reprioritized the delivery of Patriot systems to support Ukraine. Following this decision, which is in accordance with the usual procurement agreements (Foreign Military Sales), Switzerland would receive its systems later than planned. In 2022, Switzerland had ordered five Patriot systems and delivery was scheduled to begin in 2026 and be completed in 2028. No statement could be made at this stage regarding the exact timing and any further implications for Switzerland as clarifications

- Swissmedic granted authorisation for a paediatric antimalarial under MAGHP procedure: On 08 July 2025, Swissmedic, the Swiss Agency for Therapeutic Products, and national authorisation and supervisory authority for drugs and medical products, granted authorisation for a paediatric antimalarial under the Marketing Authorisation for Global Health Products (MAGHP) procedure for Novartis Riamet Baby, also known as Coartem Baby, a novel antimalarial medicine specifically indicated for infants weighing between 2 kg and 5 kg. This is the third authorisation to be granted under the MAGHP procedure, reflecting the continued development of this collaborative initiative aimed at improving access to high-quality medicines in low- and middle-income countries. The newly authorised product addresses a critical treatment gap for one of the most vulnerable patient populations—young infants suffering from malaria. The MAGHP procedure enables Swissmedic to share its scientific and regulatory expertise with regulatory authorities in targeted countries, thereby supporting regulatory capacity building while accelerating innovative treatments. access to (www.news.admin.ch/en/newnsb/EWxxtgqYCbYbyjQVYdk I)
- Swissmedic authorised vaccine to control bluetongue serotype 3: On 09 July 2025, Swissmedic, the Swiss Agency for Therapeutic Products, and national authorisation and supervisory authority for drugs and medical products, authorised vaccine to control bluetongue serotype 3. Until now no authorised vaccine has been available in Switzerland against serotype 3, but this has been rectified with the arrival of "Bultavo 3", an authorised vaccine from the authorisation holder Boehringer Ingelheim (Switzerland) GmbH. Based on the data available at the time the application was submitted, Bultavo 3 was authorised under Art. 9a TPA (Therapeutic Products Act; SR 812.21). - EFTA-MERCOSUR concluded negotiations on FTA: On 02 July 2025, EFTA Secretariat reported that the Signatory State Parties of MERCOSUR (Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay and Uruguay) and the EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) announced the conclusion of the negotiations of a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) at the MERCOSUR Summit Meeting (Buenos Aires, 2-3 July 2025). The MERCOSUR - EFTA Free Trade Agreement aims to create a free-trade zone of almost 300 million people and a combined GDP of more than US\$ 4.3 trillion. Both sides will benefit from improved market access for more than 97% of their exports, which will increase bilateral trade and translate into benefits for businesses and individuals. EFTA Secretariat added that the negotiations towards the comprehensive Free Trade Agreement were preceded by an exploratory dialogue that was initiated in March 2015. Negotiations were launched with the first round in June 2017 in Buenos Aires. A total of 14 rounds of negotiations were held. Considering the progress achieved, MERCOSUR and the EFTA States share the commitment to take the necessary steps to ensure that the Free Trade Agreement is signed in the coming months of 2025. - EFTA-Singapore concluded negotiations on Digital Economy Agreement (DEA): On 10 July 2025, EFTA Secretariat reported that EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland) Singapore concluded negotiations on the EFTA-Singapore Digital Economy Agreement (DEA). The DEA establishes a framework for digital trade between the countries, with high-standard rules and commitments that seek to boost digital trade, enable open and secure data flows, and build trust in digital systems for businesses and consumers. To facilitate seamless cross-border digital trade, the DEA includes legally binding provisions that permanently prohibit customs duties on electronic transmissions, facilitate paperless trade administration, and support electronic payments and electronic invoicing. Total trade between the EFTA States and Singapore has grown significantly over the last 20 years. In 2024, total merchandise trade between the EFTA States and Singapore reached nearly EUR 7.5 billion.
