This second Ministerial gathering followed a series of online meetings at expert and heads of delegation level in the previous week. The Ministerial meeting marked a significant milestone in taking forward the negotiations on a TEPA between India and EFTA. Both sides emphasised the importance of building their discussions on principles of trust and respect for each other's sensitivities to achieve a fair, equitable and balanced agreement. - i Bilateral: India-Switzerland
 - InSphero AG signed distribution agreement with Hyderabad based Bionova Supplies: On 25 April 2023, Swiss based pioneer of 3D cell-based assay technology, company InSphero AG, announced that it has signed a distribution agreement with 'Bionova Supplies' a Hyderabad based supplier of World class brand in the field of Biotechnology and Scientific Instruments in India for making their patented Akura[™] 96 and 384 Spheroid Microplates available to researchers in the Indian market. "The Akura[™] Plate Formats, engineered specifically for 3D cultures of spheroids and organoids, simplify aggregation and handling of spheroids and organoids and facilitates integration of 3D models into cell-based assay workflows". The plates have the unique SureXchange[™] feature to prevent unintended spheroid and organoid aspiration during near-complete medium exchange required in many applications and proved to be a key enabler for robust lab automation and screening programs. Further, the managing partner at Bionovac commented that "Through the extended partnership with InSphero, Bionova is further unlocking the world of 3D cell culture to the Indian customers." - India-EFTA took further steps towards a new Trade and Economic Partnership: On 15 May 2023, EFTA Secretariat reported that EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) in a Joint communiqué between the EFTA Secretariat and the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India Brussels informed that India and the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) States took a significant stride forward in their quest for a Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA). In a Ministerial meeting Piyush Goyal, Minister of Commerce & Industry, Consumer Affairs & Food & Public Distribution and Textiles of India; Guy Parmelin, Swiss Federal Councillor and Head of the Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research; Einar Gunnarsson, Ambassador, Permanent Representative at the Permanent Mission of Iceland in Geneva; Kurt Jäger, Ambassador, Permanent

Representative at the Permanent Mission of Liechtenstein to EFTA, WTO and the UN in Geneva, and Erik Andreas Underland, Specialist Director at the Norwegian Ministry of Trade, Industry and Fisheries – discussed the modalities of engagement for working towards a comprehensive TEPA. This second Ministerial gathering followed a series of online meetings at expert and heads of delegation level in the previous week. The Ministerial meeting marked a significant milestone in taking forward the negotiations on a TEPA between India and EFTA. Both sides emphasised the importance of building their discussions on principles of trust and respect for each other's sensitivities to achieve a fair, equitable and balanced agreement. a Bilateral / Multilaterals Meetings & Visits

- Botswana's President Masisi on a State Visit to Switzerland: On 01 May 2023, Swiss Federal Chancellery reported that the entire Federal Council received the Botswana's President Mokgweetsi Eric Keabetswe Masisi and his wife Neo Jane Masisi, during their State Visit to Switzerland. Later a meeting between President Masisi and a delegation from the Federal Council, led by President Alain Berset, was held on the development of bilateral relations and their respective positions on current global issues. The Swiss government delegation at the official talks also included Federal Councillor Guy Parmelin, head of the Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research (EAER), and Federal Councillor Ignazio Cassis, head of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA). Both sides commended the marked progress in Swiss–Botswanan bilateral relations in recent years. A further step was taken with the signing of a memorandum of understanding on future cooperation. The Swiss delegation praised the implementation of the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA), which Botswana ratified in February, as a milestone for economic integration in Africa, with significant potential for local companies as well. In addition, Swiss Federal Council also noted the importance of sustainability clauses in order to successfully conclude the talks on modernising the free trade agreement between the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) and the Southern African Customs Union (SACU). - Switzerland UK held the 1st Joint Committee for Science and Innovation: On 02 May 2023, State Secretariat for Education, Research and Innovation SERI reported that Swiss State Secretary Martina Hirayama and British Minister of State for Science, Research and Innovation, George Freeman, opened the 1st meeting of the Joint Swiss-British Committee for Science and Innovation. During her trip to London, Switzerland's State Secretary for Education, Research and Innovation, Martina Hirayama, and British Minister of State for Science, Research and Innovation, Martina Hirayama, and British Minister of State for Science, Research and Innovation, George Freeman, discussed specific areas of bilateral cooperation, namely: Horizon Europe, space, quantum science and technologies as well as science policy and diplomacy. The 1st Swiss-British Joint Committee was in follow-up tp the November 2022, as Switzerland and the United Kingdom signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on cooperation in research and innovation. This agreement set the stage for further strengthening of their bilateral partnership in these areas. SECO also added that in both bilateral and multilateral contexts, the

United Kingdom is one of Switzerland's most important partners in the area of education, research and innovation. There are numerous examples of direct cooperation between institutions and individual researchers from both countries. - Swiss Federal Councillor Guy Parmelin to pay working visit to South Korea: On 16 May 2023, Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research (EAER) reported that Swiss Federal Councillor and head of EAER Guy Parmelin would be on an official visit to South Korea from 18 to 20 May 2023. The Official Visit forms part of the 60th anniversary of diplomatic relations between Switzerland and South Korea and the Swiss-Korean Innovation Week. EAER also added that the official visit would be an opportunity for Federal Councillor Guy Parmelin to discuss economic relations with Minister for Trade Dukgun Ahn and Minister of SMEs and Start-ups Young Lee, and to sign a joint declaration with Minister of Science and ICT Jong-ho Lee. This joint declaration would aimed at strengthening existing ties between Switzerland and South Korea in all areas of research, particularly digital transformation, biotechnology and quantum technologies. The two countries would thus reiterate their willingness to continue to promote the development of their research relations. - Iceland on a Official Working Visit to Switzerland:On 22 May 2023, Swiss Federal Department of
 Foreign Affairs FDFA reported that Swiss Federal Councilor and Head of FDFA Ignazio Cassis, received his
 Icelandic counterpart, Þórdís Kolbrún R. Gylfadóttir, for an official working visit in Zurich. Discussion
 were focused on the matters related to bilateral relations, the two countries' work in the Council of
 Europe, and the future path of Europe. In addition the talks focused in particular on cooperation between
 Switzerland and Iceland within the framework of EFTA and cooperation on climate issues. Both countries
 see potential for increased cooperation in the field of carbon capture and storage. Switzerland is

 technologies and corresponding framework conditions that this requires. The two foreign ministers also
 discussed their countries' candidacies for the Human Rights Council. Both are running for a seat for the

b MoU, Agreements, Sanctions, Consultations, Rules & Regulations

• SECO published the Analysis on the Utilization of Free Trade Agreements – FTA Monitor 2021: On O3 May 2023, Swiss State Secretariat for Economic Affairs SECO along with the European Free Trade Association (EFTA) published the updated Analysis on the Utilization of Free Trade Agreements (FTA) Monitor 2021 and highlighted that due to FTAs with various countries Swiss companies saved CHF 2.4 billion. The FTA Monitor shows that tariff savings on imports into Switzerland and it also summarises the most important information for each Swiss free trade agreement (FTA) on the import and export side. In addition to general information on bilateral trade, the monitor includes a comparison of FTA and Most

Favoured Nation (MFN) tariffs as well as tariff savings and preference utilisation rates. The aim of the FTA Monitor is to enable an interested reader to see all relevant figures at a glance in order to identify both successes and potentials for improvement. For each FTA partner country, one page is devoted to goods imported by Switzerland as well as goods exported by Switzerland to said country, when available. The scope of the FTA Monitor covers both imports and exports between Switzerland and FTA partner countries for the period 2017-2021. For imports, the FTA Monitor covers all of Switzerland's FTA partners. The Principality of Liechtenstein belongs to the Swiss customs territory and its trade is included in the Swiss trade statistics. For exports, the FTA Monitor relies on data provided by FTA partner countries who have agreed to exchange the data required for this analysis. Consequently, the scope on the export side is limited to those countries who have provided such data. (www.admin.ch/gov/en/start/documentation/media-releases.msg-id-94794.html)

- Switzerland-UK launched negotiations: On 15 May 2023, Swiss Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research EAER reported that Swiss Federal Councillor and head of EAER Guy Parmelin met with UK Secretary of State for International Trade, Kemi Badenoch in Bern, which marked the beginning of negotiations on further developing the bilateral trade agreement. EAER also added that the trade relations are currently governed by the 2019 Switzerland-UK Trade Agreement, which as far as possible secures the mutual rights and obligations that bound the two states before Brexit. The existing contractual relationship is now to be adapted to current needs and further developed in the direction of a trade agreement that is as comprehensive as possible. The first round of negotiations would take place in London during the week beginning 22 May. Switzerland is aiming to integrate provisions on the trade in services, investments, digital commerce, intellectual property rights, small and medium-sized enterprises, and trade and sustainable development. The new agreement is intended to ensure non-discriminatory market access in several areas that are important for the Swiss economy. It also aims to improve legal certainty for economic exchange and contribute to cooperation between the two countries. The UK is one of Switzerland's ten most important trading partners for goods. In 2022, the bilateral trade volume in goods amounted to around CHF 13 billion, and CHF 20.6 billion if precious metals are included. With regard to the trade in services, the UK is Switzerland's third most important trading partner with a volume of around CHF 23 billion. - Switzerland adopted dispatch on Amendment of DTA with UAE: On 17 May 2023, Swiss State Secretariat for International Finance SIF reported that Swiss Federal Council during its meeting adopted the dispatch on the protocol of amendment to the Double Taxation Agreement (DTA) with the United Arab Emirates. The protocol implements the Base erosion and profit shifting (BEPS) minimum standards for Double Taxation Agreements. SIF also added that the protocol of amendment contains an abuse clause which refers to the main purpose of an arrangement or transaction and thus ensures that the DTA is not abused. It also supplements the provision on the mutual agreement procedure to bring it into line with the minimum standard. The cantons and interested business sectors welcomed the conclusion of the protocol of amendment. However, the amendment of DTA still has to be approved by the legislator in

both countries before it could come into force (<u>www.admin.ch/gov/en/start/documentation/media-</u><u>releases.msg-id-95220.html</u>)

• FINMA adopted fully revised Ordinance on Data Processing: On 26 May 2023, Swiss Financial Market Supervisory Authority FINMA reported that adopted its fully revised FINMA Ordinance on Data Processing and with this complete revision, FINMA is implementing the revised Swiss Data Protection Act in its Ordinance on Data Processing. The FINMA Ordinance on Data Processing details how FINMA processes data while fulfilling its statutory duties. Through the complete revision of its Ordinance on Data Processing, FINMA is supplementing and setting out more precisely the existing implementing provisions in light of the new federal regulations on data protection. The fully revised FINMA Ordinance on Data Processing would enter into force at the same time as the fully revised Swiss Data Protection Act on 1 September 2023. - UBS announced to complete CS takeover by June 2023: On 03 May 2023, during an event, UBS CEO Sergio Ermotti informed that UBS wants to complete the takeover of Credit Suisse (CS)" at the end of May or beginning of June" as UBS is still waiting for the approvals of the supervisory authorities in the USA, the EU and other important countries. In addition, Ermotti confirmed that job cuts as part of the takeover would be unavoidable. However, he was convinced that a large part would be dealt with through fluctuations and retirements. - UBS appointed CS CEO Ulrich Körner to the UBS Management Board: On 09 May 2023, Swiss private bank UBS CEO's Sergio Ermotti initiated changes in top management in view of the takeover of Credit Suisse and presented his new management team before the completion of the takeover of Credit Suisse (CS). In case of CS, for the time being, it would remain independent even after the takeover has been completed. As two separate parent companies, both banks would "continue to operate their subsidiaries and offices, serve their customers and do business with counterparties. UBS added that that's why CS CEO Ulrich Körner stays and he would become a member of the UBS Group Executive Board. - Federal Department of Finance convened group of experts on banking stability: On 17 May 2023, Swiss State Secretariat for International Financial Matters SSIFM reported that Head of the Federal Department of Finance (FDF), Karin Keller-Sutter informed the Swiss Federal Council that the group of experts on banking stability had been convened, which would led by Jean Studer, former President of the Bank Council of the Swiss National Bank (SNB). Jean Studer would present the FDF with independent strategic considerations on the role of banks and the framework conditions at federal level with regard to the stability of the Swiss financial centre. This report would form the basis for the report on systemically important banks in accordance with Article 52 of the Banking Act, and for the postulates mentioned. The group of experts is free to set its own priorities, while taking into account any clarifications and investigations by the overall parliamentary supervisory bodies. SSIFM also added that the expert group is comprised of representatives from academia, banking and economics and membership includes former employees of the SNB and FINMA. - Japanese law firm to start a lawsuit over CS bond default: As per the news published on fuw.ch, on 22 May 2023, in the dispute over the Swiss authorities declaring the subordinated AT1 bonds of Credit Suisse worthless, a Japanese law firm is apparently preparing to file a lawsuit. The law firm Masuda \mathcal{E} Partners wants to round up as many AT1 creditors as possible to submit an application for international arbitration proceedings against Switzerland, reported the "NZZ am Sonntag" in its latest edition. The lawyers apparently want to assert the violation of the investment protection agreement between Switzerland and Japan. Such bilateral agreements are intended to offer foreigners legal protection for their direct investments in the other country. In the event of a dispute, investors could complain directly to an international arbitral tribunal, wrote the "NZZ am Sonntag" (NZZaS). Because these are treaties under international law, the "host state" cannot evade its obligations through its national legislative options. According to the NZZaS, the majority of foreign creditors whose home country has concluded an investment protection agreement with Switzerland are likely to both take part in an arbitration action and lodge a complaint against FINMA's ruling, who represents several creditors before the Federal Administrative Court. As part of the takeover of the troubled Credit Suisse by UBS, which was ordered by the authorities on March 19, the so-called Additional Tier 1 bonds (AT1) of CS with a total nominal value of around CHF 16 billion were declared worthless. - FDF ordered measures on remuneration at CS and UBS: On 23 May 2023, Swiss State Secretariat for International Financial Matters SSIFM reported that the Swiss Federal Department of Finance (FDF) issued an order cancelling or reducing the outstanding variable remuneration of the top levels of management at Credit Suisse. At the same time, the FDF has instructed UBS to design its remuneration system for the employees responsible for the realisation of the Credit Suisse assets covered by the federal guarantee such that the system provides an incentive to achieve the fewest losses possible on the realisation of those assets. With these two orders, the FDF has implemented the Federal Council decree of 5 April 2023 on measures relating to remuneration at CS and UBS. The currently outstanding variable

remuneration for the top three level of management at Credit Suisse would either be cancelled (Executive Board) or reduced by 50% (members of management one level below the Executive Board) or by 25% (members of management two levels below the Executive Board). This takes account of the most senior managers' responsibility for the situation at Credit Suisse in a differentiated manner. Moreover, variable remuneration for these management levels due in 2023 would be cancelled or reduced on a pro rata basis until the takeover is completed. In addition, Credit Suisse must examine the possibilities for recovering remuneration already paid out to members of group management since 2019, and to report to the FDF and FINMA on the matter. FDF also added that the employees are not party to the order procedure, as the order is directed exclusively at CS. The order replaces the interim injunction of 21 March 2023 and subsequent FDF CS. measures concerning remuneration at (www.admin.ch/gov/en/start/documentation/media-releases.msg-id-95363.html)

- UBS to select CS investment bankers in a very targeted manner: On 24 May 2023, Swiss private bank UBS, that acquired Credit Suisse (CS) recently reported that UBS wants to select CS investment bankers in a very targeted manner. Chairman of the Board of Directors Colm Kelleher also added that UBS wants to be very selective when selecting employees from the Credit Suisse it has taken over as the takeover of employees from the CS investment bank set an "incredibly high bar". Kelleher spoke at a Wall Street Journal finance conference in London on Wednesday. According to the report, Kelleher commented that it is clear that CS's investment bank is "out of control" and he wants to preserve the UBS culture after the takeover of the competitor that got into trouble. The transaction would be completed shortly, Kelleher said. UBS has announced that the CS takeover would be completed by the end of May or early June. - Switzerland earned CHF 100 million with CS rescue: On 26 May 2023, Swiss Federal Councilor and head of Federal Department of Finance Karin Keller-Sutter in a statement reported that till now Swiss Federal Government has received CHF 100 million from bonuses from Credit Suisse (CS) on fees on liquidity support to stabilize the reeling Credit Suisse. Finance Minister Karin Keller-Sutter also added that in addition to the provision and risk premiums, there is also income from the National Bank and explained that the outstanding liquidity support, which is secured by federal guarantees, would currently amount to five billion francs.(www.fuw.ch/bund-verdient-mit-cs-rettung-bisher-100-mio-fr-921786698487)
- Ivanishvili vs. CS: Credit Suisse ordered to pay damages in Singapore: On 26 May 2023, the International Commercial Court in Singapore found that Credit Suisse had breached its obligations in the case of Ivanishvili v Credit Suisse (CS). As can be seen from the judgment of the International Commercial Court in Singapore, the damages to be paid by the CS subsidiary Credit Suisse Trust would be reduced by payments already made of \$79.4 million. In addition, the damages already awarded in proceedings in Bermuda must also be included in the calculation so that there are no extensive duplicate claims. Accordingly, the bottom line of the damages awarded by the Singapore court is probably a good \$500 million. It did not want to comment on the extent to which CS made provisions for the Singapore

- Switzerland joined efforts towards securing global supply and value chains: On 09 May 2023, Swiss Federal Department of Economic Affairs, Education and Research EAER reported that since Switzerland wants to help make global supply and value chains more secure and so strengthen their resilience. The resilience of global supply and value chains has been affected by pandemics, wars, natural disasters and other events. In adopting the Joint Statement on Cooperation on Global Supply Chains, Switzerland wants to help make these chains more resilient. Ensuring security of supply with essential goods is also a key element of this cooperation. At the Supply Chain Ministerial Forum in July 2022, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Costa Rica, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, the European Union, France, Germany, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Mexico, the Netherlands, the Republic of Korea, Singapore, Spain, the United Kingdom and the United States took the decision to work together to address such crisis situations. Since then, a number of further countries have joined the original signatories: Costa Rica, the Czech Republic, Ecuador, Estonia, Norway, Panama, Serbia, Uruguay, Israel, and now Switzerland. - **FSO reported an increase in organic production in 2022**: On 09 May 2023, Swiss Federal Statistical Office (FSO) as per its findings of the farm structure census reported that in 2022, 48 344 farms were counted in Switzerland, 1.1% fewer than 2021. However, FSO also recorded that in 2022, an increasing number of farms turned to organic farming as every sixth farm was an organic farm (16.2%). At 1 042 000 hectares, the utilised agricultural area was almost as high as in 2021. Livestock numbers developed differently: while the number of dairy cows decreased slightly (-0.5%) and that of pigs increased slightly (+0.5%), the poultry population grew significantly (+4.3%). - Dufry Group reported an increase in sales in 1st Quarter of 2023: On 10 May 2023, Swiss-based global travel experience player 'Dufry' with operations in 75 countries. Dufry also operates duty-free and duty-paid shops and convenience stores in airports, cruise lines, seaports, railway stations and central tourist areas. It announced that sales from January to March were CHF 2.36 billion, which is organically an increase by 51% as compared to 1st quarter of 2022. Dufry also added that the increase in sales was also due to its acquisition of Autogrill Group. The company also reported that sees itself well positioned for the future as the outlook for the current year was confirmed. Accordingly, the travel retailer wants to grow by 7 to 10% and, that coincoides from the merger with Autogrill, which led an increase the core EBITDA margin by 75 to 100 basis points. - SNB sold its US stocks to fight inflation: On 10 May 2023, Thomas Jordan, President of the Swiss National Bank (SNB) informed that in order to counter the inflation in Switzerland the SNB's foreign exchange investments are particularly important. In the 1st Quarter of 2023, SNB had already provided a

huge emergency loan for Credit Suisse, then it negotiated the forced takeover of Switzerland's second largest bank by UBS and finally secured it with immense liquidity support. Further, despite all this, SNB was still busy doing her real job, which was to ensure price stability in Switzerland. Therefore, in March 2023, SNB to combat elevated domestic inflation, it continued to raise interest rates and has been active in international markets, as evidenced by the performance of its massive US equity portfolio. In the first quarter of 2023, its package of American securities increased in value by 4.7% to \$145.9 billion. SNB also added that in the 1st quarter of 2023, of the 2,600+ US stocks it held, SNB reduced weight in over 2,500 stocks. Foreign currency investments increase when the SNB intervenes to weaken the franc and, above all, buys dollars and euros, which it has done regularly since the financial crisis. - **Biopharmaceutical company Evolva signed partnership agreement:** On 05 May 2023, Swiss biopharmaceutical company Evolva announced to have signed a partnership agreement with a contractor. Evolva also added that as a result of the agreement, Evolva is now able to supply vanillin to a global customer in the flavors and fragrances industry. • Hilti Group recorded an increase in sales by 5.4% in 1st Quarter of 2023: On 16 May 2023, Liechtenstein based multinational company 'Hilti' that develops, manufactures, and markets products for the construction, building maintenance, energy and manufacturing industries, mainly to the professional end-user reported an increase in sales by 5.4% to CHF 2,142 million in 1st Quarter of 2023. Hilti also added that Americas business region achieved an increase of 13.7% with double-digit growth rates in North and Latin America. In Asia Pacific, revenue increased 17.0%, driven by strong performance in South Asia and the Pacific region. On the other hand, China's recovery, has been sluggish due to the delayed resumption of construction projects after the COVID-19 lockdowns. In the Eastern Europe / Middle East / Africa region, sales declined by -15.1% which was to be expected given the ongoing war in Ukraine. • Liechtenstein's public sector generated budget surplus of CHF 177 million in 2021: On 23 May 2023, Economic Department of Liechtenstein Marketing reported that in 2021, public sector in Liechtenstein generated a budget surplus of around CHF 177 million. It also added that government spending amounted to 22.6% of GDP. According to the Financial statistics 2021 published by the Office for Statistics (AS), the public sector in Liechtenstein recorded income of 1.854 billion Swiss francs in 2021, however in comparison 2020, it recorded a decline of 20.4%. At 52.3 percent, taxation again made the greatest contribution to the public purse in 2021. The state's net assets totaled approximately CHF 9.8 billion as at year-end 2021. This represents an increase of CHF 389.9 million (+4.2 percent) as compared to 2020. Just under 42 % of the state's net assets are held by social security funds, with the state level accounting for a share of 36.6% in this regard, and 21.4% attributable to municipalities and citizen cooperatives. S&P confirmed AAA rating for Liechtenstein: On 30 May 2023, the Economic Department of • Liechtenstein Marketing reported that as part of its half-yearly review, the rating agency S&P Global Ratings confirmed the AAA rating for Liechtenstein. The outlook remains unchanged at stable as well, with this Liechtenstein became one of just 11 countries to have been awarded a top rating from S&P Global Ratings. The rating agency expects the economy of Liechtenstein to recover over the course of this year. While the economy certainly remains under pressure from the indirect consequences of the war in Ukraine, weak demand on the export markets and rampant inflation, it has also repeatedly shown a capacity in the past to rapidly adjust to changes in the economic landscape. Prime Minister of Liechtenstein Daniel Risch added that the top rating also confirms the attractiveness of the principality as a secure and stable business location, while also underlining the importance of a proactive approach and the creation of effective economic framework conditions. In Europe, the only other countries with a top rating are Denmark, Germany, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland. Outside of Europe, Australia, Canada and Singapore have been awarded top ratings. • EFTA Council held 3rd meeting in 2023: On 03 May 2023, EFTA Secretariat reported that the EFTA Council met in Geneva on 3 May for the third time this year and for the seventh time under Liechtenstein's Chairmanship. Delegates were informed about EFTA-EU relations, including recent Subcommittee, Standing and Joint Committee meetings and preparations for the upcoming EEA Council on 24 May. Further, delegates reviewed third-country processes including the recent fifth round of

negotiations with Chile in Santiago in late March, the fourth round of negotiations with Thailand in the last week of April, and progress in the negotiations for a Digital Economy Agreement with Singapore. On India, delegates discussed the meeting at ministerial level that took place in New-Delhi on 26 April on prospects of resuming the negotiations towards a Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement. - EFTA-Vietnam held talks on FTA negotiations: On 12 May 2023, EFTA Secretariat reported that high level delegation from EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) and Vietnam held meeting in Geneva and took stock of their ongoing Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations. The meeting was co-chaired by Helene Budliger Artieda, Swiss State Secretary at the State Secretariat for Economic Affairs (SECO), on the EFTA side, and Tran Quoc Khanh, Deputy Minister of Industry and Trade on the Vietnamese side. During the meeting, discussions focused on a few negotiation topics, i.e. trade in goods, services and investment, government procurement, intellectual property rights, and trade and sustainable development, with the ambition of finding common ground towards finalisation of the negotiations. The EFTA-Vietnam negotiation process began in 2012, and since then, 16 rounds of negotiations have taken place. In 2022, bilateral trade between EFTA and Vietnam exceeded USD 4 billion. - EFTA-Singapore held 3rd round of negotiations towards a Digital Economy Agreement: On 17 May 2023, EFTA Secretariat reported that delegations from EFTA States (Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland) and Singapore virtually held third round of negotiations toward a Digital Economy Agreement (DEA). The two sides engaged in further discussions and exchanged views on the majority of the articles tabled for the DEA, Further the delegations also agreed on an article on online consumer protection, which requires each Party to adopt or maintain measures to ensure the effective protection of consumers engaging in e-commerce transactions. They further cleaned provisions throughout the draft DEA, including under the planned article on paperless trading, which aims to ease trade transactions by requiring the Parties to make trade administration documents publicly available in electronic form and to accept their legal equivalence with paper documents. The EFTA States and Singapore also achieved additional understanding of their respective approaches to the provisions on cross-border data flows and the protection of personal data. Member States: Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland. The role of the Committee is to advise EFTA countries on all issues relevant to EFTA such as its relations with trade partners outside the European Union, and the relations of Iceland, Liechtenstein, and Norway with the EU through the extension of the EU Internal Market to these three countries via the EEA Agreement.
